She was an instructor at Antioch School of Urban Ministry and a social work studies professor at the College of New Rochelle. Over this period, Minister Nikki made major contributions to the development of the understanding of “Inner Healing” and the need to help educate and empower men and women to truly heal from their past and live a life of purpose.

Minister Nikki inspired many to aspire to higher levels of academic excellence and scholarship.
