
### **WHAT IS IDEAL** CABINETRY?





## PAINTED CABINETRY

The most requested material is painted cabinetry, most often white. All of our painted doors are made from MDF. This is an extremely durable material that is routed out on a CNC. The CNC cuts out every door in one piece. This avoids cracking as there are no seams. Our cabinets are primed, and painted with a catalyzed paint. This type of paint provides an extremely durable finish that is easy to clean.



# CABINET

All of our unexposed interior parts are made with a 5/8" melamine. Melamine is a type of crystalline plastic that has excellent wearability. It also holds up well to moisture and is extremely easy to clean.



Exposed interior parts are made from a 3/4" MDF core with a hardwood veneer. The parts are sanded, stained, and sealed with a lacquer finish. We use a wide variety of cabinet materials such as Maple, Hickory, Red Oak, White Oak, Alder, and many more.



### STAINED CABINETRY

We offer a wide variety of stain colors as we mix them in house. This means we can easily match our cabinetry to any existing trim piece or woodwork. One unique thing about our stained cabinets are our doors. We pre-finish all of our door parts prior to assembly. Wood expands and contracts due to changes in moisture from season to season, so pre-finishing eliminates the unfinished edge lines.
