Item 8. The Whale View Point Coastline Enhancement Project called for several elements which have now been shut down by the City in one form or another. Relocation of the parking on the west side of Coast Boulevard to open up the view corridor was deemed impossible by the City in 2015; last month, the City concluded that creating an educational stencil on the sewage pump station, which was designated by the Enhancement Project as the "Educational Plaza," was undesirable due to what the City considers to be unacceptable maintenance responsibilities; this month, the City concluded that the drainage ditch in the 300 block of Coast is a "wetland" such that invasive species cannot be removed and replaced with native coastal vegetation. The City still promises that the sidewalk will be complete by Memorial Day so, should that happen, we will see how to take fresh looks at these disappointments.

Item 9. Except as hereafter provided, all donations to LJP&B are non-refundable.
