Donald Albert Hill-Eades (Labourer) 1909 - 1989

continued to live at Worms Ash.

Donald grew up in an agricultural family and later sought a better, more regular income in Industry. He had been working on the railways for a short time when, In 1937, he was injured working at the Aston Fields Wagon Works. He recovered and quickly returned to life as a Market Gardener.

Donald Hill-Eades' Parents, Ephraim Hill & Gertrude Eades were married December 26th 1908 at Kings Norton Parish Church. Ephraim was from a family of agricultural labourers in Alvechurch, Worcestershire. Gertrude was from a family of Nailmakers in Catshill, Worcs.

The 1911 census finds the family at 19 Twyning Road, Stirchley Birmingham. Ephraim 26 Chocolate Worker, Gertrude 26 wife, Vera O age 1, Donald A age 1, Gertrude age 4months. Also at the address were 3 of Gertrude's siblings, Mary Eades 23 Chocolate Worker, Nellie Eades, 20 Chocolate Worker and Arthur Eades 16 Chocolate Worker.

Unusually Donald also appears on a second 1911 census return from Worms Ash, Bromsgrove. Job Eades 54 Market Gardener. 1911 October 24th, Donald's mother, Gertrude Hill was buried at Kings Norton Parish church. It seems likely that with the illness and death of his mother, Donald had been adopted by Gertrude's uncle Job and

1916 January 1st, Donald's Father Ephraim Hill, Chocolate Worker age 31 remarried to Rhoda Read, age 23 at the Parish Church in Belbroughton, Worcestershire. Ephraim went on to raise 3 more children with Rhoda

The 1921 Electoral Roll records Job, Elizabeth and Arthur Eades residing at Worms Ash.

1937 April 15th Donald A Hill-Eades is injured while working at the LMS Wagon Works at Aston Fields, Worcestershire. He was trapped between two moving wagons suffering bruising and shock. The incident prompted a move back into agricultural work and later that year he is once again described as a Market gardener.

1937 November 6th, Job Eades passed away. He left the residue of his estate split between his son Arthur (Market Gardener) and nephew Donald Hill-Eades (Market Gardener).

The 1939 Register finds Donald (Market Gardener) and Mary living at Worms Ash. There is one other person at the address, (details redacted as under age 100 at the time of data release - Possibly Vera Hill, born Bromsgrove 1938 (Q3 6c 355))

The 1950 Electoral roll finds Donald and Mary at Brooms Green, Gloucestershire. Just a mile south of the church where they were married in 1936.
