

Welcome to the 2017 Hall Of Fame Dinner! Redlands High School deeply appreciates your support and attendance. RHS has over a century-long tradition of excellence in athletics, and this night is a wonderful celebration of athletes, coaches, and the athletic programs that have been part of the Long Blue Line.

RHS enjoys a rich, 126-year history of competitive athletics. If you scan the first yearbook, you will find pictures of proud athletes, both males and female. One of the things that sets the Redlands High School Athletic program apart from other programs is the focus on character, ethics, hard work, and the concept of “team above self”. We believe that this is one of the reasons that our teams and our athletes have achieved such great success through RHS and beyond for a dozen decades. Throughout our history, we have fought for many titles, developed many great athletes, and have been honored to support countless dedicated coaches. There have also been thousands and thousands of Terrier athletes that have participated simply for the joy of the sport, for being part of a team and for being part of the RHS **Long Blue Line**. In addition, RHS is proud to be one of the following members of the Citrus Belt League, and the only school that has stayed in the league throughout its history.

The 2016-2017 school year was another great one for RHS Athletics. The Terriers captured four CBL titles including Badminton, Boys’ Swimming, Boys’ Tennis, and Softball. The Terriers are extremely proud of their CIF Championship team- the three-peat Boys’ Tennis Team. Last year, two Terrier athletes were selected as winners of the Ken Hubbs award: Lauren Kendall (Golf), and Doug Haugh (Football, Baseball). Last year, **each of our twenty-three teams received the CIF Scholar Athlete Award which is given to varsity teams with an average GPA of 3.0 or above.** This milestone has been reached very few times in CIF history, but was achieved by RHS twice out of the past three years. We would not have these opportunities for our students if not for our coaches. I am thankful for each of our coaches, and am honored to work with them each day.

At tonight’s Hall Of Fame celebration, we honor six athletes who are proud to be called Redlands Terriers. Congratulations to Henry Horta – ’63, Camille Clarendon Dahnke – ’00, Al Garcia – ’56, Leo Guest – ’56, Michelle Solomon – ’11, and the 1917 State Championship Men’s Track Team. My deepest appreciation goes to the members of the Hall Of Fame Committee for making this event happen. It is a heartwarming and enjoyable evening each year.

The track season opened this year with a rush when the Seniors walked away with the Inter-class Meet on February third. The Juniors took second, and the Freshmen and Sophomores came in somewhere in the rear.

On February tenth, Coach Lutz took his squad of cinder path pounders to Claremont, where they met the fastest college team in the South. Frost was the star of the meet, winning first place in both the mile and the half-mile. He defeated Captain Walter Sturges of the college, a feat not before accomplished in the South in the last three years. The final score was sixty-five to forty-seven in favor of the college.

On February seventeenth, R. H. S. sent a team of seven men to the A. A. U. Relay Carnival, held at Bovard Field. These seven men won both the mile and the half-mile relays, bringing home eight gold medals and a beautiful cup.

On February twenty-fourth we had a dual meet scheduled with Manual Arts, but it was necessarily postponed because of rain.

On March third Pomona High sent their track team up and got walked on by Redlands. Frost won the mile and the half; Yount both the hurdles; Seltzer the four-forty; Sawyer the discus; Allen the hundred and two-twenty, not to mention seconds and thirds. Pomona

won only two firsts. The final score was seventy-five and a half to thirty-seven and a half.


On March tenth Manual Arts had agreed to meet us, but at the last minute backed out. Manager Harris got U. S. C. 'Varsity to meet us to fill the vacant date. We, of course, could not win; but we put up a fine showing. The result was sixty-five to forty-eight in the University's favor.

On March seventeenth Pomona College Freshmen came up so try their strength against R. H. S., and were found too weak for our fast aggregation. The meet was interesting, however, and some good time was made. The final score was seventy-six and a half to thirty-six and a half.

In these practice meets our team did wonderfully well, and Coach Lutz deserves a great deal of credit for this.

CITRUS BELT LEAGUE MEET

Dear old R. H. S. motored to Claremont, with the finest track team she has ever had, on March twenty-fourth, and in a decisive manner defeated all comers to the C. B. L. Our fast and handsome track squad galloped away with fifty-five of the precious points, while Chaffey took second with twenty-four points. We got



a good start in the meet when Frost stepped out in the eight-eighty yard run and broke the record in the good time of 2:04 $\frac{3}{4}$. This made all of us feel fine. In the next event Captain Allen stretched out his lanky legs and won the hundred-yard dash. This made us feel still better. A few minutes later, Seltzer tore around the track, kicking up all kinds of dust, so fast that all were

behind him at the finish of the four-forty. Everybody felt glorious then, and all looked happy as kings. The crowd settled down to watch the victory which was sure to come, and when it came everybody said "Rah! Rah!" and hit for the field, where a splendid serpentine was held. "Pretty soft," said Lutz. ALL-SOUTHERN MEET

For the first time in many, many years, Redlands High School carried away the honors at the All-Southern Track and Field Meet. The meet was held at Long Beach on March thirty-first, and was the best and most closely contested meet ever held in the South.

The meet started with Frost winning the hardest half he had ever run in his life in the good time of 2:04½. He was boxed during all the race and didn't get out until the last corner was reached. When he did escape, he was a long way behind, and it was only by his wonderful sprint that he won.

Captain Allen ran a hard hundred, and got fourth place against the fastest men in the South.

When the four-forty came, Seltzer and Gass both drew exceedingly poor starting places, and they did not have a fair chance to win. Nevertheless, Seltzer stepped out and took third place in this.

The mile came and Frost and Knowlton took to the track. Frost tore out and Knowlton followed closely behind him. Near the end of the last lap a runner

passed Frost. "Humph," said Frost, "some poor guy making his last sprint!" But Frost misjudged him, for the athlete sprinted to the finish, winning in the fast time of 4:35. Frost got second and Knowlton fourth.

Meanwhile, Green was pole-vaulting and throwing the discus. He "did his durndest," and got second place in the discus and third in the pole.

Yount stepped out in the low hurdles and "copped" fourth place. He also sailed out in the broad jump to a distance of 21 feet 9½ inches. This broke the All-Southern record, but Rogers, on his last jump, went 22 feet four inches, and Gene Davis went 21 feet 11 inches on his last jump, so that Yount got only third out of it. This was a surprise, because Yount jumped a foot further than he ever had before.

The relay was left to decide the meet, and Redlands went after it for all she was worth. Poly High of Los Angeles won, but Redlands got second.

Redlands High finished first with a total of twenty-two points. Pasadena was second with twenty-one, and five-eights points, and Manual Arts third with nineteen. The meet was a fight from start to finish between these



schools, and even at the end the result was not known. Pasadena, running a man under protest, was given first place; but soon, however, it was proved that Silvas was twenty-three years old. So Redlands won the meet in a fair and square manner, and it will never be forgotten by the students of R. H. S. We now have the cup, the trophy, in the corridor, the prettiest trophy in the State, given by the Los Angeles Tribune. Three cheers for the Southern California Champions!

ALL-STATE MEET


The Redlands High School sent a track team north to compete in the All-State meet which was held this year at Berkeley, on the University of California Oval. Through the generosity of the merchants and different individuals of the city, enough money was obtained to send a four-man team accompanied by the coach and manager. The meet was held April twenty-eighth.

R. H. S. finished in fourth place in this big meet with a score of fourteen points. This doesn't sound very big, but when one considers that some of the schools

had twenty men entered, and that there were fifty-six high schools and some two or three hundred participating, it makes our showing a great deal more creditable.

The meet started with a rush when Frost crossed the line in the eight-eighty yard run in second place. He ran against the fastest half-mile man in the West, and his showing against him was very good. The time was two minutes and two seconds. In a short time the mile was run off, and Frost again finished second against Reeves, of Pasadena, in the fast time of four minutes and thirty-seven seconds. This was a fast mile, and Frost had finished a fast half only a short time before, so his showing in this race was also good.

The big race of the day came a little later, when the four-forty yard dash was started. Seltzer, of R. H. S., drew number twenty-four as a starting place. Number twenty-four is an exceedingly poor place from which to start, but Seltzer was equal to the occasion. He ran in the position he drew until the last corner was made, then he started down the straight stretch at a breakneck speed. He passed every man in front of him, and won the race by fifteen feet. When Seltzer won the race he



won for himself the honor of being the fastest four-forty high school man in the State of California.

During the running of these races Green was pole-vaulting around eleven feet three inches. Green had been working hard all the year, and now he was to receive his compensation in the way of second place in the All-State meet.

Yount, our fourth man, had, meanwhile, been broad jumping mightily. He sailed out to a distance of twenty-one feet four and a half inches. This was just one half


of an inch short of the qualifying distance. Yount could, no doubt, have jumped twenty-one feet ten inches if he had had one more trial, for he jumped twenty-one feet nine and a half inches at the All-Southern meet.

The meet and the trip was a complete success. The fellows had a good time, and the coach was elated over the showing made.

We are mighty proud of our team, of their continuous striving for the school, and of our coach.




