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Summary

Between the dates of 01-15-21 and 03-05-21, while employed under the Curry County Sheriff's Office as the director of Emergency Services, Jeremy Dumire took advantage of his official position to take approximately \$1,015.80 worth of property for personal use and also gave some of the property away.

Action Taken

On 03-19-21 at approximately 11:30am, Sheriff Ward requested I investigate the disappearance of 11 cases of Meals Ready to Eat, that had been provided to Emergency Services, which at the time had been under the direction of former Emergency Services Director, Jeremy Dumire.

Sheriff Ward told me that the Meals Ready to Eat had been ordered by Anthony Voudy of the Veterans Administration and arrangements made for the purchase were done through Dumire. Several pallets of Meals Ready to Eat were ordered.

Sheriff Ward stated he had seen 12 cases in Dumire's office sometime after January 15, 2021. Sheriff Ward took one box to be stored in the Sheriff's Office. I was further told that the cases were valued at approximately \$100.00 each.

Dumire resigned his position as the director of Emergency Services on March 05, 2021. Shortly after this, Sheriff Ward and Captain McDonald went to the Emergency Services Office to take an inventory and noticed the Meals Ready to Eat were gone.

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Captain McDonald's attempts to reach Dumire by phone met with negative results.

Sheriff Ward was able to confirm with Voudy that Voudy had left 12 cases with Dumire for Dumire to use as needed for Emergency Services.

On 03-01-21, at approximately 1:00pm, I contacted Dumire at his residence. I explained to Dumire that I was looking for 11 cases of Meals Ready to Eat that were missing.

Dumire told me that he took the Meals Ready to Eat, because they were given to him by Voudy for helping get Voudy Meals Ready to eat. Dumire also stated that he had done the same thing a couple years back. Dumire stated he gave some of the cases to friends and that he used them when hunting or camping or anytime he needed to.

After Dumire told me this, I asked him if he could step outside with me because his children were in the house.

I activated my body camera and told Dumire I was recording. I again asked Dumire about the Meals Ready to Eat and recorded his statement. It should be noted that my body camera was initially in standby mode and when I activated the camera and told Dumire I was recording, the camera automatically goes back approximately one minute and shows that time as recorded also.

After obtaining his statement, I asked Dumire for any cases he had left and he went inside to get them. I started to complete a citation to appear. As Dumire and his son came out with the Meals Ready to Eat, I put them in my patrol car. Dumire provided me with five cases. I asked Dumire if he could get any of the cases back that he gave away and he was not sure.

Dumire was issued Oregon UCC # 18056 charging him with Theft in the First Degree with a court date of 04-19-2021.

There were two types of cases of the Meals Ready to Eat. Case A has menus 1 - 12 valued at approximately \$90.00 each. Case B has menus 13 - 24 valued at approximately \$94.30 each.

Values were determined from Amazon price list. Amazon is known to be a low price vendor for purchasing items.

I recovered from Dumire one case of A containing menus 1 - 12 and four cases of B containing Menus 13 - 24. Sheriff Ward had one case of A containing menus 1 - 12.

It is believed that four cases of A containing menus 1 - 12 and two cases of B containing menus 13 - 24 are still missing.

It is believed that Dumire took five cases of A containing menus 1 - 12, which would be valued at \$450.00 and six cases of B containing menus 13 -24 valued at \$565.80. A total value of \$1,015.80

At approximately 1:36pm, I made telephone contact with Anthony Voudy with the Veteran's Administration. I asked Voudy if I could record our conversation and he agreed. A verbal statement was obtained from Voudy.

Voudy confirmed giving Dumire 12 cases of Meals Ready to Eat, but Voudy understood the meals would be used for Emergency Services needs. Voudy never intended the Meals Ready to Eat to

be used for Dumire's personal use.

Sheriff Ward forwarded a single picture from his phone. This picture was of Voudy's phone showing a screen shot of Dumire's contact with a note stating "Dropped off MRE's 12 boxes". This picture is dated Jan. 15, 2021 at 1:25pm.

On 03-23-21, I contacted Voudy and requested he forward any messages he had between him and Dumire regarding the Meals Ready to Eat. Voudy sent me the same picture that I recieved from Sheriff Ward along with a brief text message string about how many boxes Dumire was requesting. Voudy also included a copy of the invoice for the Meals Ready to Eat.

Statements

Verbal in substance statements provided by Jeremy Dumire:

Statements prior to recorder activated:

1. I gave some to other people as well.
2. It was the same as last time we got the cases two years ago.
3. I only got a couple the last time.
4. That's not the impression I got. (Asked that these were for Emergency Services no his personal)

Statements when recorder activated and Dumire advised:

5. He' (Anthony Voudy) been asking me... let's back up.
6. Couple years ago it came to my attention that there were some MRE's available through state surplus.
7. Tony (Voudy) was wanting to get a couple of pallets.
8. A pallet is \$480.00, I managed to do that two years ago.
9. Two years ago, Tony gave me some.
10. I gave some to Tolowa nation, which he knew I was doing that.
11. I kept two maybe three cases I'm thinking.
12. I use these for hunting and what have you.
13. This time around, He had been on me for pretty much the entire time, two years.
14. Hey if anything comes up again let me know. (request of Voudy to Dumire)
15. So it came up again, hey how many you want?
16. Got two pallets to him.
17. He said how many do you want for you and I said a dozen.
18. Thats what this text message is.
19. So he gave me a dozen boxes.
20. I stored them at the E.S. (Emergency Services Office).
21. Cause just because I didn't feel like loading up in the truck at that pint.
22. Gave several cases away t different people.
23. I like may have four of them left right now.
24. Just different friends. (Asked who he gave them to)
25. I'm not sure (asked if purchased with county money), could be lottery funds.
26. Yea, but Voudy bought them.
27. As I understand he was giving those out to people in general as part of his program.

I commented that Voudy gave him the cases for the Emergency Services and Dumire corrected me.

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28. To me. (Indicating the Voudy gave the cases of MRE's to him personally)
29. If you want four cases, I got four cases.
30. I'll have to get up in the attic to fetch them up for you.

Second Recording as Dumire got the remaining cases to me.

31. I got five. (cases of MRE's)
32. They were given to me.
33. They are already chowed down or whatever. (Asked if he could get any of the other cases back)

Verbal in substance statements provided by Anthony Voudy:

1. So, let me refer to this text message real quick. (Asked how many cases of MRE's he gave Dumire)
2. It was 12 to my knowledge, but I'll have to double check real quick.
3. I have to look if it was a message or messenger.
4. So on January 14 at 11:37 AM, January 14, 2021, I asked him how many he wanted me to set aside for him.
5. He said if I could set aside a dozen, that would be ideal.
6. I said no problem.
7. He wasn't able to come down that week because the Sheriff had just took his vehicle back, away from him.
8. So I told Addy, Adali Pitman, my coworker, when she goes up the next time for to pay the county bills and pick up the mail, We'll load up a dozen boxes in the back of the truck and she can take them up to Emergency Services and Jeremy.
9. I told her specifically, but she didn't do it completely the way I said
10. I said have Jeremy unload them, you don't help.
11. These are like 25 pound boxes.
12. You don't need to do this, just let Jeremy do it.
13. So she called Jeremy, again Adali Pitman, the other Veterans Services Officer here at...
14. She called Jeremy when she got up there on June 15th at 1:25pm.
15. Phone call was approximately 25 seconds.
16. She told Jeremy something to the extent, I'm out front in the county veteran service truck, I have those MRE's.
17. So her and Jeremy were sitting there, she went to go take the mail in and she actually helped, I believe, take four or five boxes into Jeremy's Office at that time.
18. So what happened was she dropped off these MRE's in front of his office with him there.
19. Then when the Sheriff inquired, I asked her if she still had here call log.
20. I screened shot the call log and I then sent it to the Sheriff.
21. Reason being is those were boxes given to Emergency Services because it was kind of an in kind thank you for ordering the stuff for us.
22. I knew they could use them to...because historically in the past he used them.
23. And so I was like when an emergency rises there are something spare to have at the office, you know.
24. No. (Asked if he ever thought the MRE's were for Dumire's personal use.)
25. If they were something that was for personal use I would have a job.
26. That's why I specifically had them taken up in a county rig to Emergency Services.
27. No. (Asked if Dumire state how he planned to use the MRE's)
28. I just thought they were for Emergency Services, whether he was using it when something happened, if he was out on the road and didn't have a lunch.

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29. It wasn't my thing, I give these things out anyways.
30. I give them out free, to my veterans.
31. I had some older ones, if you want to have a couple for your office, its a thank you for helping me, because he was the one that put some work in getting them, ordered and the last time he had to actually go up and pick them up, I believe in NorthBend.
32. For me a thank you for what you did.
33. I'm looked at it as if he needed a couple of ink pens and I had extra ink pens, its the same thing.
34. Correct. (Asked if the MRE's were for Emergency Services)
35. Not for personal use of Jeremy Dumire.
36. That why I said specifically they were brought up in a county rig, to a county facility by a county employee.
37. I just couldn't break away that day, otherwise, I would have personally took them up to him.
38. I believe it was maybe three years ago. (Asked when Dumire picked up the MRE's in Northbend)
39. He was the one that actually informed me that he had access to MRE's through the D.A.S. system.
40. I thought that's awesome, I could use these to give out to our homeless veterans.
41. We had purchased them and he got the invoice processed and I believe it was two pallets, there were a couple given off that to.
42. But again, those thing only have about a two to three year shelf life, it depends on the heat, they have to stay below 60 degrees, if they stay above 60 degrees there is a heat sensor on them and it can decrease the shelf life from six months to a year to three years.
43. When I give these they are already one to two years old.
44. You have a 1-3 year life span.

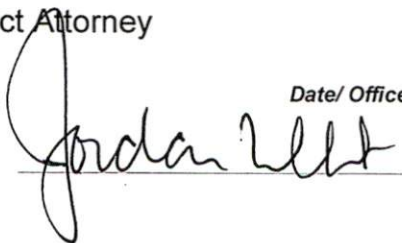

Action Taken

On 03-24-21, I recieved a phone message from Attorney Nathan Garcia, I returned the phone call. Attorney Garcia told me that he was representing Jeremy Dumire and that Dumire had recovered the remaining cases of Meals Ready to Eat. Attorney Garcia stated it was permissible for me to go to Dumire's residence and recover the cases. I was also told that Dumire and his wife, Erin (Johnson) Dumire would have written statements for me along with a letter from Attorney Garcia.

I then contacted Dumire by phone to make arrangements to pick up the items. Dumire was having trouble printing off the documents and stated he would contact me when he was ready. I provided Dumire with my work cell phone number.

At approximately 1:39pm, Dumire sent me a text "2pm?-Dumire". I responded that I would be there.

At approximately 1:59pm, I arrived at Dumire's residence and activated my body camera. I observed the cases of Meals Ready to Eat near the front door. Dumire and his wife Erin were standing there. They were advised I was recording. Dumire gave me the written statements and I confirmed there were no other documents he wished to submit with these and there were not. Dumire and his wife then went inside.

I then loaded the seven cases of Meals Ready to Eat into my vehicle and left the residence. It seemed odd to me that there were seven cases instead of only the six missing cases. Throughout my investigation the number of cases given to Dumire by Anthony Voudy has always been 12. Six cases were accounted for on March 19th, 2021, when the investigation started.

Once back at the Sheriff's Office, I photographed the seven additional cases and saw that the lot numbers and expiration dates matched the cases from the 19th.

On 03-25-21, at approximately 3:06pm, I contacted Voudy at his office for Veterans Services and obtained a follow up statement which was recorded and Voudy was advised.

Voudy's statement remained the same as before and he did not agree with the statements written by Dumire and his wife Erin.

Voudy then let me look at his Meals Ready to Eat in his storage room. I was also told there were more out in the connex behind the building. I looked at many of the boxes, but many were buried, and the only lot number I saw on any of them was 8047 with an expiration date of 2/21. Many of the cases recovered from Dumire had lot number 6077 with an expiration date of 3/19.

I followed Voudy out to his vehicle where he got his cell phone and showed me a text message received from Dumire on March 19 at 3:08pm, asking him to call Dumire. Voudy told me he ignored the text message and I did not see a response text message on the phone. The screen image is captured on my body camera recording.

It should be noted that the text to Voudy from Dumire on the 19th at 3:08pm, would be approximately one hour after I left Dumire's residence on the day I started the investigation and issued Dumire a citation to appear.

I then recorded an interview with Adali Pitman, Pitman was advised I was recording. Pitman confirmed that she delivered the cases on 01-25-21 to Dumire at his office and that her understanding was the Meals Ready to Eat were for Emergency Services and the services they offer to the public, not for Dumire's personal use.

On 03-29-21 at approximately 8:16am, I returned to Voudy's Office and asked if I could inventory his stock of Meals Ready to Eat and he agreed.

First I inventories the cases stored in the connex. I counted 81 cases and all were lot 8047 with an expiration date of 2/21.

I then inventories the cases in the store room. I counted 39 cases with lot 8047 with an expiration date of 2/21. I also found one open case with lot #6077 with an expiration date of 3/19.

One Hundred Twenty One case were counted total. Voudy told me had purchased a third pallet of 48 cases and had probably delivered approximately 20 cases to veterans. Voudy also told me that the case with lot 6077 was most likely still left from his purchase two years ago.

On 03-29-21, I reviewed surveillance footage from the Sheriff's and State Courts parking lot camera. For the date of 01-15-21, I observed what appears to be the Veteran's Services pickup, due to the graphics on the side. The vehicle parks along the curb of the street. A person presumed to be Dumire can be seen coming from his office pushing an empty cart. Items are taken out of the back of the pick up truck and put on the cart and the person is seen pushing the cart back to his office. Distance is too great to make any type of actual count or even make out definitively what was loaded on the cart. What was observed matches the description of events provided by Pitman. No recording of this event was made.

Verbal in substance statements provided by Voudy:

1. Is that just recently?
2. Yeah. (Asked if he met with Dumire on March 11, 2021)
3. I told him the Sheriff talked to me about his MRE's and his job.
4. That was in the very beginning before I knew all what was going on.
5. As an employee working with you, I'm just letting you know the sheriff had questions about MRE's, you might want to talk to him (Sheriff) about it.
6. I said I found it really odd.
7. Sheriff didn't say anything about anything other than do you know if Jeremy go any MRE's.
8. I said ya.
9. So I was like hey, you know, I just want to give you a heads up, Sheriff called me about the MRE's, I don't know what's going on, but figured I'd give you a common courtesy.
10. Because I found it odd.
11. I could take you and show you the batch I don't it is. (Asked if any of his cases of MRE's are expired)
12. If he does have MRE's that are expired that's from two years ago.
13. The first batch that we ordered.
14. To my knowledge these still have a year or two left on them.
15. I can go grab one, its literally right in the back right here.
16. I get them and we just open them and hand them out where we have have transients that come through that are vets.
17. So I don't pay attention to the year.
18. But, I think its usually there is one to two years left on them minimum.
19. She was. (Asked if Erin was with Dumire when they met out back)
20. So I went out the back door.
21. I talked to him right there (pointing at video surveillance screen), because my truck, my work truck was actually in the parking spot, one parking spot, so this is the door right here, it was actually right here.
22. They were two spots over.
23. I think there might have been a kid in the vehicle and she was on the phone.
24. She was not with us.
25. It was just me and him talking and it was literally all of a minute and a half maybe.
26. I just want to give you a heads up that I found it odd that the Sheriff called about the MRE's I gave you, something happened to them or what.
27. The original conversation was weird with the Sheriff, I don't understand what is going on.
28. No. (Asked if he ever told Dumire that he gave him the MRE's for personal use.)
29. I didn't give them to him.
30. That's the thing, thats why this is all funny.
31. Adali Pitman was the one that delivered them for me on behalf of me from our office to his office in Gold Beach.
32. So he didn't come here to pick them up from me.
33. I didn't take them to him personally.

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34. They were delivered from on office to another in a county vehicle to a county office.
35. And it wasn't for personal use of Jeremy Dumire.
36. It was for Emergency Services, however they found fit.
37. Not at all. (Asked if meeting on the 11th was to get story straight.)
38. It was to give him a common courtesy, like he, you were a former employee that worked with us.
39. The Sheriff never said anything in the beginning except for hey, did you give Jeremy any MRE's.
40. And because there had been talk about an invoice before, it was three or four times previously when I first ordered it.
41. There was always this hook up like, hey where are these MRE's going?
42. Did you order MRE's?
43. I found it weird, why is the Sheriff calling me about MRE's, but this was when I first ordered it.
44. I was like, I don't know, so when Jeremy, I called him and said hey, the Sheriff, I need to talk to you for a minute, I found it odd the Sheriff called me about MRE's, you might have something going on, I don't know what it is, but you might want to call the Sheriff.
45. He actually said he had a missed call from the Sheriff.
46. I was like, oh, okay, I just found it odd that the Sheriff was calling me, initially for this.
47. That's interesting. (Allowed to read Dumire's statement).
48. You might want to ask Adali (Pitman) what happened that day.
49. Not at all. (Asked if the written statement was accurate.)
50. I literally told im, he, they called, i thought it was odd, you might want to reach out to the Sheriff, I thought it was odd that the Sheriff was calling me about one of his employees and I truly didn't understand why I was getting the initial phone call.
51. I knew that he had been in some hot water, but it was like a common courtesy.
52. Awesome. (Allowed to read Erin (Johnson) Dumire's statement.)
53. Not at all. (Asked if that statement was accurate.)
54. Like I said, I called him and said hey, I got a phone call from the Sheriff, you might want to call him, that when he said he already had a call or a message on his phone, and that was it.
55. She couldn't have been close enough, there was my work truck, me and him on this side and then two parking spots in between, so there is no way, there no way she could even hear what I said.
56. And nervous, I got PTSD and I got ADD so I'm always nervous, it doesn't matter to me, like I'm always agitated and high strung nervous. My 10 year old could tell you.
57. She'll straight up tell you.
58. If you ask her,, dad always acts nervous?
59. I'm always on edge.

Verbal in substance statements provided by Adali Pitman:

1. So that day (01-15-21), Tony (Voudy) had asked me to take up some MRE's to Jeremy at Emergency Services.
2. I was going up there to check our mail and drop off some claims that I usually do.
3. So we loaded the truck up, county truck, I drove up there and he told me to give Jeremy a call, because they're heavy boxes and I can't lift them up.

4. There was about eleven or twelve of them.
5. He said to give Jeremy a call, so I had Jeremy's work cell phone number.
6. So when I pulled up in front of the Sheriff's parking lot, I called and said I was there.
7. He said okay, I'll be right out to unload.
8. He came out with a cart, looked like a cafeteria cart or something to load them in.
9. I helped him unload a few, then I went in to check the mail and started to leave and he left.
10. Just that they were going to another department, you know, Emergency Services. (Asked what she thought the purpose of the MRE's being delivered were for.)
11. We use them or homeless veterans and people that are having emergencies or in need of food, that's what my understanding was.
12. No, not to me. (Asked if Dumire stated what his plans for the MRE's was.)
13. I called him, I'm here, you know.
14. Yes, definitely. (Asked if she believed the MRE's were for Emergency Services.)
15. No, not at all. (Asked if she thought the MRE's were for anyone's personal use.)
16. I was just sharing, I just was thinking Emergency Services, I know that he had done the order for us so I thought it was kind of like as a department we were sharing.
17. No. (Asked if Voudy ever said the MRE's were for personal use.)
18. To Emergency Services, it was for emergency services.
19. Yes. (Asked if she thought the MRE's were for official use.)
20. Just dropped them off, It was all for work.

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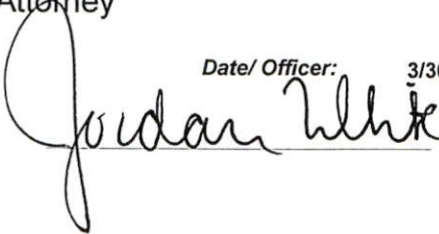

Dear Lieutenant Ensley:

I represent Jeremy Dumire in the above referenced matter. With this letter, please find:

1. A witness statement from Jeremy Dumire;
2. A witness statement from Erin Dumire (her number is 541-373-9063);
3. Text message correspondence between Jeremy Dumire and Tony Voudy (Director of the Curry County Veteran's Office); and
4. Jeremy Dumire's resignation letter from Director of the Office of Emergency Management.

I would request that you make the above referenced documentation part of a supplemental report that will be provided to the DA's office for this case.

I reached out to you on 3/24/21 to let you know that Mr. Dumire had procured the return of the remaining MRE's that he'd given away to various friends so he could return them to CCSO. The MRE's have been returned with the delivery of this letter to you (or another CCSO Officer who accommodated the retrieval of the MRE's).

The return of the MRE's is not to an admission of culpability. Mr. Dumire specifically denies culpability and his position is that the MRE's were given to him personally by the Director of the Veteran's Office, Mr. Tony Voudy. However, given CCSO's view of the situation, Mr. Dumire wanted to return the MRE's so that it's clear that no harm has been done.

Due to the nature of Mr. Dumire's resignation, I view this matter as quite political,

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particularly when a reporter from the World and the Pilot reached out to the DA's Office and to Mr. Dumire regarding this matter before the DA's Office had even received the police report in this case or knew anything about the matter.

I do not believe that it is in the best interests of the County for this situation to be blown out of proportion or magnified. It was not Mr. Dumire's intent to steal anything. Some may view it as unwise for him to have accepted MRE's that were purchased with County funds, but I would wager that if a magnifying glass was put to any Curry County employee's life, including the board of commissioners, plenty of faults could be found. It is not my desire that this case unfold in this manner, but I will vigorously defend Mr. Dumire should it be necessary. I typically steer clear of local politics because local politics do not interest me. I'd certainly like to keep it that way.

Nathan,

Regarding the MRE's:

Approximately two years ago I helped Tony Voudy locate surplus MRE's for his Curry County Veterans Office. The MRE's were procured from the Oregon Department of Administrative Services (DAS), with Mr. Voudy's office purchasing two pallets. The purpose for Mr. Voudy purchasing the MRE's, as I understood both then and now, was to give them away from Veterans Services.

After receiving that shipment of MRE's, Mr. Voudy did ask me to keep an eye out for any future opportunities to procure additional pallets. On several occasions during this timeframe, Mr. Voudy would contact me to inquire if any MRE's were available. His requests for MRE's were increased during the COVID-19 pandemic. By early January 2021, DAS notified me that MRE's were available. I worked between both Mr. Voudy and Joe Mannion (DAS) to help

procure two pallets of MRE's. I recall the purchase price, not including shipping, to be \$960 (\$10 per box of 12 MRE's; 48 boxes per pallet x 2 pallets equalling 96 boxes totalling \$960, plus shipping). Reference: <https://surplus.app.works/property.php?id=124392&i=0> . Mr. Voudy, as the department head, paid for the MRE's with funds available to him in Veterans Services.

On January 14th, Mr. Voudy directly received the shipment of 2 pallets of MRE's delivered to his office in Brookings. Mr. Voudy texted me and asked "when u coming this way", in reference to my picking up some of the MRE's. I responded that I wasn't sure, and that I was tied up at my office the rest of the week. Mr. Voudy replied "No problem let (me) know when ur heading down don't stress." He continued "Insure (I'm sure) they will be here unless ww3 happens," and followed that up with "Hey how many was I supposed to set aside for you boxes." I asked if I could get a dozen. On Friday, January 15th, Mr. Voudy called me and told me that he would have a dozen boxes dropped off to me while I was at work.

(At this point, I want to note the citation from Lt. Ensley lists Sunday, January 17th, as the offense date. The cases of MRE's that I took to my house were moved in February)

On Friday, February 26th, I emailed Sheriff John Ward my letter of resignation (copy sent to you in prior email). In my letter I offered two weeks notice, which would have provided my effective end date to be around March 12th. However, per Captain Phil McDonald my last date with Curry County was March 3rd. On that date, Captain McDonald asked me what needed to be done to effect my termination (outstanding items, etc). I told Captain McDonald that I needed to turn in some equipment that was at my house, including radios and satellite equipment that had been used in the course of my job. I returned that equipment during the lunch hour, and by approximately 2pm, was severed from employment.

On Thursday, March 11th, I missed a call from Captain McDonald. He left me a voice message that stated he was looking for a couple things and requested that I give him a call. I returned his call at 1:18pm on that same day; however, was not able to speak with him directly and left a voicemail on his phone. Captain McDonald left me a voicemail the following week on Monday, March 15th, in which his message stated "hey, we are playing phone tag. Give me a call..." When I received that voicemail, I knew at the time that Captain McDonald was not in the office (it was after normal shift hours when I noticed the message on my phone) and did not call back on that date. On Friday, March 19th, Lieutenant John Ensley stopped by my house. After greetings, I offered Lt. Ensley to come inside my home.

Lt. Ensley stated that Captain McDonald and I were in the midst of phone tag, and that he was at my house to find out what happened to the MRE's that were at my office. I told Lt. Ensley that I had distributed several cases, and that I had a couple cases. I told Lt. Ensley that the cases were given to me, and I showed Lt. Ensley the text message I had from Mr. Voudy in which I was asked how many cases I wanted. Lt. Ensley argued that the cases belonged to Emergency Services and were the property of the County, to which I disagreed. Lt. Ensley ordered me to give to him the cases that I had. I complied with his order, and gave Lt. Ensley the cases that I had. Lt. Ensley then issued to me a citation for Theft I. Lt. Ensley asked if I knew the status of the dispersed cases of MRE's, and stated that, if I could get any of them back, that I should do so.

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It is important to note that during the morning of March 11th, both Erin and I were in Brookings when I received a call from Mr. Voudy. Mr. Voudy asked, since I was in Brookings, if I could swing by his office. I did so after I finished my shopping at Bi-Mart. When I met with Mr. Voudy, he met with me outside of his office. Mr. Voudy stated that Sheriff Ward had called him and asked about the MRE's that Mr. Voudy had given to me. Mr. Voudy seemed to be out of sorts, and told me that he told Sheriff Ward that I "had probably thrown them in the trash because they were expired." Mr. Voudy affirmed that he had given the MRE's to me, and referenced the fact that even he had some MRE's and that he would use them during hunting and camping trips. When I spoke with Lt. Ensley I did not offer the made up story given to me by Mr. Voudy, and instead told Lt. Ensley the truth as I had stated above.

Five cases of MRE's have been given to the Sheriff's Office so far, by way of Lt. Ensley during the visit on Friday, March 19th. I have retrieved all remaining cases (7), and await your assistance in turning those over to the Sheriff's Office. While I disagree that the cases are County property, not mine as I had believed, I refuse to be thought of as a thief and would like to have this latest issue with the County dealt with appropriately. I left the County due to the mental and emotional stress I endured; this additional stress is not warranted.

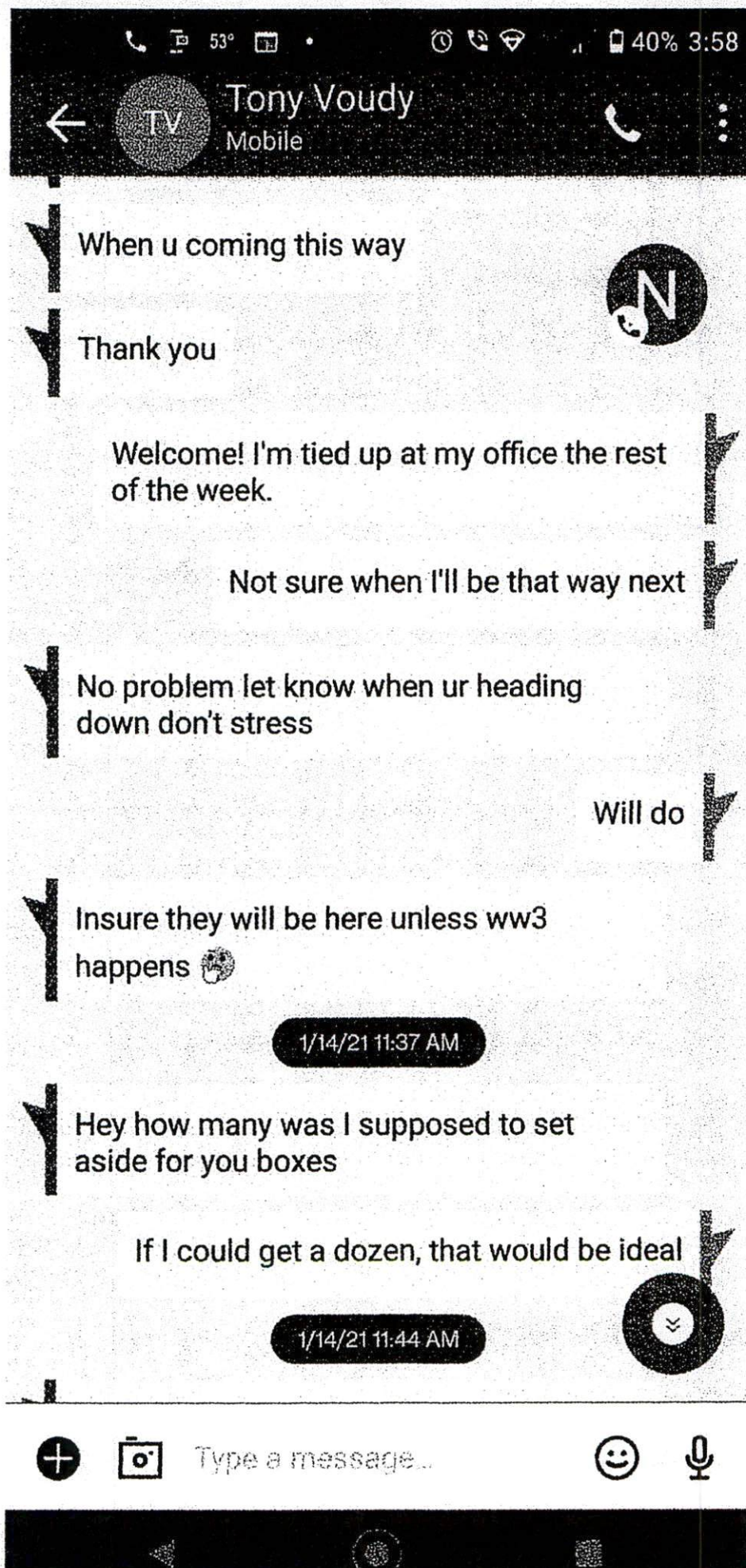

Voudy appeared to be nervous and aggravated. He proceeded to explain that he had received a call from Sherriff Ward that morning and they were inquiring about some MRE's that Captain McDonald had seen in Jeremy's office before he had resigned. They wanted to know the number of boxes that had been given to Jeremy. I specifically heard Voudy tell Jeremy that, "I told Johnny that the MRE's were probably expired, and he just threw them in the dumpster. I told him they were probably the old ones I gave him 2 years ago." He then went on to say that Ward had called Tad the maintenance guy to ask if he had noticed boxes of MRE's being thrown away in the last month and were looking at video footage to verify the number of boxes taken out of the office. Voudy talked about wanting to make sure their stories lined up and stated that it seemed like they were going after Jeremy. He did talk about how he had given the MRE's to Jeremy personally and how they liked to have them on hand when they went hunting or camping.
