Shop Update

tips and tricks

Lubricating a saw blade.

This is a very simple tip but it is important. We normally use beeswax to lubricate a saw blade. In the old days, they used ear wax!! Anyway, the wax should be applied to the BACK of the blade…not the front. Why? Because if it is applied to the front, it will fill the teeth and on the first draw through the metal it will collect swarf (the fine metal dust resulting from the cutting) and fill the teeth. Then it will dull the teeth and reduce their cutting efficiency. Instead, simply apply the wax to the rear of the blade. In this way, friction melts the wax and evenly spreads it on the blade as needed to keep it lubricated and clean.
