

TIPS from Lapidary Journal Jewelry Artist April 2016 and August 2016

When Resoldering, don't pickle because it leaves a residue. Soak piece in boiling hot water bath to remove flux residue and follow with Dawn detergent using a brass brush to clean solder joint. Dry, re-flux and resolder as required.

Use non-toxic BIC water base Wite-Out correction to block or stop solder flow into unwanted areas. When using liver of sulfur to darken metal try using a magic marker to block of areas you don't want to darken. Later acetone will remove magic marker.

Don't quench hot metal in pickle. Allow sterling to cool 10-15seconds before quench in cold water to avoid cracking. Repercussions to hot pickle are:

- The mist of steam and fine acid drops the become airborne are inhaled into your nasal cavities and lungs. The tender membranes of your eyes are also exposed.
- The acid mist eats small holes in your clothing.
- The acid rusts and corrodes the bright shiny steel tools in the workshop.

How to work-harden nonferrous metal:

- Rolling in a rolling mill.
- Hammering, usually between steel hammer heads and steel bench plates; using a mallet made of a hard plastic such as delrin may also compress metal over steel.
- Drawing wire through a draw plate.
- Bending or twisting
- Tumblers does not work-harden metal

Meeting Agenda November 6, 2018
