

Rock Tumbler Basics

Are you in the market for a rock tumbler, but not sure what type to buy? A ROTARY tumbler has a system of barrels that rotate around a metal cylinder to tumble and polish the rocks inside. It's easy to use and creates smooth, polished stones in 30 to 45 days. Rocks often come out with a rounded shape regardless of what they looked like when they went in. A VIBRATING rock tumbler doesn't actually "tumble" the rock. Instead, the cylinder that holds the rocks vibrates - creating friction between the rocks and the grit material. Because the rocks are moving less, they are polished much more quickly than with a rotary tumbler, usually within 7-10 days. A vibrating tumbler polishes, but does not change the shape of your stones. (from Gold Rust Trading Post)
