Utah Picasso Marble

Marble is a common building stone, it is a classic sculptor's stone. Some marbles are famous such as Italian White and Belgian Black marble. The colors vary and may by ground in pinks, yellow and browns. Marble is a soft rock and yet dense in structure. It was once limestone in the Precambrian era. The sedimentary limestone masses were sometimes contacted by hot magmas and the pressure altered the limestone. Other minerals from the magmas then infiltered the limestone causing feathery lines and beautiful designs such as Picasso Marble found in Beaver County, Utah. The scenic effect and color contrast in black and gold has made this marble a popular cutting rock for the lapidaries. The Zion Prospector
