



Agate found in the gravels of Louisiana is no longer the state gemstone.

Following the 2010 Deepwater Horizon oil spill when 665 miles of coastline were affected, the **eastern oyster** *Crassostrea virginica* is a bivalve mollusk with a hard calcium-carbonaceous shell in cabochon form was made the state gem of Louisiana in 2011. It is hoped the new gemstone would bring favorable attention to Louisiana's oyster industry that is struggling to rebound after the spill.

The eastern oyster, like all members of the family Ostreidae, can make small pearls to surround particles that enter the shell. These pearls, however, are insignificant in size and of no value; the pearl oyster, from which commercial pearls are harvested, is of a different family.
