




Jesse Jinghan Liu

Hailing from Beijing, China, Jesse Jinghan Liu (b.1999) graduated from the School of Visual Arts in 2022 with an illustration major, she currently resides in California as a full-time artist. In March 2023, Jesse held her inaugural solo exhibition, Spring Fever, at Yiwei Gallery.

Jesse's work is predominantly oil-based, with long-haired female figures serving as the central motif. Drawing inspiration from both the imagined nocturnal world and the minutiae of everyday life, and intertwines these elements with her personal experiences. Her works employ a vivid color palette and interplay of light and show to convey a spectrum of emotions with specific contexts. Specializing in using composition to emphasize the significance of narrative storytelling, to create a sense of mystery or romance in their atmosphere.

Kay Seohyung Lee



Raised bilingual, she moved to the US at 14, grappling with her identity and experiencing constant otherness. Lee's work reflects absurdity, chaos, and solitude, drawing inspiration from her desires, despairs, and the complexities of her life. In her recent "Hellscapes" series, she explores body, gender, sexuality, religion, culture, language, and relationships through diverse mediums. Lee holds a BFA from Washington University and an MFA from the University of Pennsylvania. She currently resides in Philadelphia, lecturing part-time and exhibiting internationally.

Dai Ying, born in 1983 in Emei Mountain, Sichuan, China, currently lives in New York, Los Angeles, and Beijing. Dai embarked on her artistic journey at the age of five, studying Chinese calligraphy and painting. In 2011, she committed to a full-time art practice since her move to New York, continuing to create to this day. Her academic pursuits took her to the Academy of Arts & Design at Tsinghua University and the Central Academy of Fine Arts in China, where she engaged in Associate Fellow programs.

Dai Ying's artistic endeavors span a wide range of mediums, including mixed-material canvas paintings, large installations, performance art, video, and the initiation and organization of art projects. Over the years, she has participated in numerous art exhibitions both in China and internationally. Her recent solo exhibitions include No Dust to be Wiped at the Huguo Guanyin Temple in Beijing (2023), Suddenly Moon White at the Guo Yunlou Cultural and Art Center in Suzhou (2023), and In Memory of Forgotten at the Today Art Museum in Beijing (2020). Her work has also been exhibited in group exhibitions, notably at Cui Zhenkuan Art Museum (Xi'an, China), Ruotong Gallery (Shenzhen, China), YOUNG Art Museum (Shanghai, China), Taoxichuan Art Museum (Jingdezhen, China), and Kommunale Galerie (Berlin, Germany), Pasadena Convention Center (Los Angeles, CA), World Trade Center (Baltimore, MD), among others.

Dai Ying's work has been featured in significant publications and media outlets, including Chinese Morphological Expressionism (Xi'an, China, 2024) and Chinese Female Art (Beijing, China, 2020), and DAILY NEWS (New York, NY, 2015). She has also received numerous honors and awards, including a research fellowship at the World Art Center since 2015 and prestigious awards from the United Nations Artists Association, Asia Art Funds, and the World Art Center. She has served on the board of directors at the Asia Art Funds since 2015.

Through her diverse body of work and significant contributions to the art world, Dai Ying continues to explore and expand the boundaries of contemporary art, bridging cultures and connecting with audiences across the globe.






Kay Seohyung Lee *Harvest*


