

Clovis Schlumberger is a Franco-American artist based in Paris and Los Angeles. He holds a Master's degree from Ecole des Beaux-Arts of Paris.

Schlumberger is particularly interested in semiology and visual codes. He first experimented on how the Renaissance geometrical composition of an image could influence the perception of the content.

Schlumberger also created an alphabet based on human physical postures (which was performed during the "Nuit Blanche" in Paris in 2018).

His latest installations explore the visual language of the Internet Memes and our emotional addiction to the digital devices.



The exhibition explores the interplay between escapism, addiction, and alluring artificial worlds. The artist invites the viewers to reflect on the impact the "virtual" has on our lives and psyche.










Head in the Cloud 16 x 28in, acrylic on canvas
