KEVIN











Kevin, a six-month-old stray kitten found in Lockhart, Texas, was our first tripod rescue. A good Samaritan found Kevin and contacted our friend Sharri Boyett, who connected us to help. When we picked up Kevin, his back left leg was injured and infected with nerve damage - likely from a car. He had an unknown skin condition and an upper respiratory infection (URI). Kevin's prognosis was antibiotics and a surgical removal of his back leg once he was healthy enough for surgery. Kevin fought for his life in our care. There were many days we weren't sure he was going to make it. However, Kevin pushed through and became a vocal, sweet siamese kitty he was always meant to be! Before being placed in his foster to adopt home, Kevin became a Facebook sensation, and his supporters asked for updates on him each week. We fell in love with Kevin and are grateful to donors such as Shadow Cats and others who contributed towards his vet bill. We also thank Dr. Hannah Wilson for getting him through his prognosis. Kevin is now named, 'Timothy' for 'God's Beloved.'

REGAL







Regal, a dog pulled from the euthanasia list in Guadalupe County was heart worm positive and struggled with food aggression. Despite this, his adoptive parents worked with him and gave him a forever home, bringing joy to all involved in his rescue journey. Regal was transported all the way from Texas by Kingdom Rescue to his forever family, Chris and Elyse in Newnan, Georgia! We receive regular updates on his progress!



GINGER











Ginger was found locked in a horse trailer during the brutal (below 20 degree) Texas freeze that lasted for days in December. No covering, no heat lamps, no protection. She was left alone and neglected for over 9 months, controlled by a shock collar, by her previous owner. She was rescued and received emergency medical care, diagnosed with heart worms and suffered from a severe UTI. Ginger's cruelty case is a reminder of the neglect and abuse that exists in the world and the importance of supporting animal rescue missions. Ginger is now happily adopted with her forever family and brother named "Cash".

TRAP, NEUTER, VACCINATE, AND RETURN (TNVR)

The dedication and hard work of rescue volunteers, including Elvia Diaz and Sandra Michna (board member), have made a significant impact in Caldwell County by spaying and neutering over 200 homeless and owned cats. Similarly, Kingdom Rescue, with the help of many donors, have been able to fix over 25 cats from a colony of 44 cats in Luling through the Trap, Neuter, Vaccinate and Return (TNVR) program. These efforts not only address the issue of overpopulation, but also improve the overall health and well-being of these animals. Their compassion and commitment to animal welfare serves as an inspiration to others in their community and beyond.
