Svany Svavars Kristjansson... international autism consultant and lecturer, has worked with children and adults with autism for over 45 years. She has worked as a speech-language pathologist, autism classroom teacher, mentor, and consultant for all levels of children and adults with ASD, and has presented at numerous state, national and international autism conferences as a featured speaker and continues to work as a TEACCH Instructor at UNC. She received her master's degree in speech pathology from the University of North Carolina (UNC)-Chapel Hill and is a Certified Independent TEACCH Instructor.

The TEACCH-Structured Teaching Model training/STM uses evidenced-based strategies to create a framework for program service delivery. The intensive 4-half day format will focus on: understanding the characteristics of autism; learning styles, assessment; behavior and problem solving; physical structure (schedules, tasks, work systems); visual supports, communication, social, and play skills as well as steps to starting a classroom.

Program Objectives-Participants will:

- Use the TEACCH-STM model to create strategies for teaching academics, communication, social, and play skills
- Use the principles of physical structure to design a classroom
- Use structure to create individualized student schedules and work systems
- Use the principles of visual organization and visual supports to create appropriate student tasks/assignments
- Devise strategies to assist their own students to learn more effectively and appropriately
- Use knowledge gained to problem solve student responses based on their autism traits

Training will consist of four hours each day, combining lecture, discussion, and small group breakout sessions. Homework must be completed daily, creating various projects that allow participants to apply learning from that day. Completed projects will be photographed and explained in writing, and then emailed to the trainer for feedback.
