Annual meeting of the ISO Conference

For the past seven years, the annual meeting of the Conference was held in October; however, the Board of Trustees has decided to return to holding the annual meeting immediately preceding the convention, as was done in the years before 2018.

This year, the annual meeting of the Conference will be held on Friday and Saturday, May 23-24, 2025, immediately prior to the convention in Austin, TX. Note that this results in a short service year.

The deadline for motions to be considered by the Conference is March 1, which will allow the Conference Planning Committee time to vet them and make them available for review by area assemblies and member groups at least two months before the meeting.

SAA international convention, May 2025

The 2025 international SAA convention will be hosted by the Austin, TX, intergroup. A program of speakers, workshops, and social events is being planned by the Convention Committee.

SAA Concepts of Service

CSC Twelve Concepts subcommittee is planning to present a final draft version of the proposed new <u>SAA Concepts of Service</u> at the annual meeting of the Conference in Austin, TX, this coming May. This will begin a one-year period for review of the concepts before they are formally presented for consideration by the ISO Conference.

For these new concepts to become the official SAA concepts, they must be approved by a three-fourths majority of Conference delegates at two consecutive annual meetings of the Conference.

Updating the Green Book

The ISO Literature Committee (LitCom) has announced a year-long project to update Sex Addicts Anonymous, the SAA Green Book. In particular, the LitCom has called for new stories from members with long-term sobriety and significant service experience.

Stories addressing how the Steps were worked and difficulties encountered and overcome should follow the now-classic pattern of "what it was like, what happened, and what it is like now." Also, recovery from newer electronic means of acting out would be of particular interest.

Consider writing your story and share this invitation with members of your local group. No one needs to be a skilled writer. LitCom is prepared to edit and polish any submission while preserving the author's voice.

Stories should be approximately 3-5 type-written pages and can be submitted with a signed release to info@saa-recovery.org.

Opportunities for service within the ISO

A draft of the proposed SAA Service Manual is available on the service website for review and comment by members of the fellowship. Since information in the Service Manual is subject to frequent changes, it is envisioned that the manual will be available only online.

For members without internet access, printed copies will be available from the ISO office.

Members are encouraged to review this informational document and to offer feedback via the available online form.

There are many opportunities to participate in service to members of the SAA fellowship. Most of the committees within the ISO welcome members of the fellowship.

A particularly helpful role in guiding ISO activities is played by the outreach committees that focus on serving the needs of specific members of the fellowship, such as women, men, LGBT members, and members who are incarcerated.

Other committees, such as Information Systems and Online Presence, Public Information and Cooperation with the Professional Community, and Literature, focus on and advise the ISO on matters related to specific activities.

Then, there are elected bodies that oversee defined duties within the ISO, such as the Board of Trustees, Literature Committee, Conference Steering Committee, and Conference Nominating Committee. Interested members may attend their meetings as guests but are not able to vote.

140 prisoners are awaiting assignment to an SAA member who is willing to work with them.

This is an opportunity to carry the SAA message of recovery to a sex addict who is incarcerated—putting Step Twelve and Tradition Five into action.
