NEW LOCATION DESIRED

ess. The pay is one (1) peso a Kilo, which is like 5 cents a pound for plastic bottles. It is estimated that 30 bottles equals a kilo. So imagine the number of bottles we collect in a week to account for the \$20.00 dollars worth of bottles. We also are collecting aluminum and steel cans, and scrap iron. We have been averaging about \$70.00 a week.
