Another great turn out for the bazaar. The sun shown and the people crowded around from various communities to see what this bazaar brings. Many of our new




friends we have made from Morelos, arrived excited to find linens and household items for sale at cheap affordable prices. We had a steady flux of people from 8 am

He was driving on their equivalent of our interstate highway around 7 am at the bus' top speed of 59 mph when he hit some thick fog. The dips in the road and pot holes swash you around in the bus like ping-pong balls but now he had the added challenge to find them in the fog. Driving with extra caution now that visibility was shortened, a Curve sign ap-

peared from behind this low lying cloud and he hit his brakes. The bus reacted by sliding sideways.



He let up on the brakes and veered a hard right hitting a pot hole which somehow brought the bus under control around the curve. Teens were screaming "Cristo Salvame" [Christ Save Mel who obviously heard their plea. We arrived safely and he was given the honor to give the message to the youth before heading home. They came across a wreck on the return trip home that caused everyone to get out and walk across the bridge as they coaxed Pat in the bus to squeeze between the wrecked truck and a deep ravine where the dirt was loose. In December, Gary and Leslie Martinez from Crossroads Ministry in Roseland, LA. donated a 1999 Dodge 15 passenger van to us. It became our transportation home since we hitched a ride up to the states from fellow missionaries Phil & Marianne Chain. We loaded the van with bazaar items and lots of clothes for the clothing ministry and headed back to the border when we heard a loud clunking noise while stopping for gas. Pat discovered it was the clutch fan. Since it was late, we decided to stay where we were and get a mechanic in the morning before the fan jumps off and damages the radiator. As God provides, there was a hotel less

than 1/4 mile up the road & a mechanic another 1/4 mile from the hotel. 1st thing in the morning, Pat

headed to the mechanic and waited over an hour for him to get to work before Pat decided to look for another

mechanic a little further up the road. After going less than 100 feet to the other mechanic, the fan jumped off and went through the radiator! Pat

called the 1st mechanic whom he had initially gone to and realized it was his day to go to the border to

look for car parts. But to the goodness of his heart, he came running over to work on our van. He took off the damaged parts, proceeded to the border to continue his business rounds and got the parts we needed fixed. Isn't God's mercy and provision wonderful?

After he replaced the clutch and fixed the radiator, we were

back on the road again within 48 hours. We arrived safe and sound in San Andres Tuxtla 2 days later.
