STARRY NIGHT VISITS

The Kingdom Conquerors visit the local Civil Hospital in town once a week. We bring drink and food to the families of patients who sleep for days at a time outside under the stars. rain or shine, while waiting for their loved one's discharge, relocation or wellness. It is amazing to see so many with blankets and bags of personal items huddled in masses on the sidewalk under the tiny eaves of the hospital building. One couple sought us out

using the directions from a tract they had received the night before. They were desperate for financial help. The 78 year old mother was hospitalized for a broken leg 4 days earlier. The Hospital never tended to her because the family couldn't afford the operation and now they needed money to pay for her 4 day stay. God networked people together who were able to assist them with this problem. What a great opportunity

NEW LOCATION DONATED

There was a knock on the door one morning from a small real estate agent in town who heard from a relative that we were looking to purchase a place of our own. Under God's conviction of never have given

his tithe, he decided to tithe to us one of his lots in a rural residential area outside the city limits. As a church, we purchased the adjoining lot

to double our lot size to 14 X 22 mts with the hopes of safeguarding our new investment. We feel sure God is up to something when He speaks to total strangers who wish to tithe

a parcel of land to Casa de Gloria when their *own* children attend another church! We feel this is an investment to hold onto for future use, because there are no Christian churches in this community. We

made an appointment to see the Mayor about a local building we had been eyeing to use for Sunday morning Celebration service.

To our sur-

prise, the property we were interested in is her personal building. So without hesitation, she said since it wasn't being used on Sundays, she had no problem loaning it to us for a

season until we find something of our own. Now we are able to raise up flags and streamers, Pat can dance without hitting his head, and new families are beginning to attend our more spacious services. God gave one lady who re-

cently moved to Tecolapan, a dream about where she was to attend church. Through some investigating, she found us just as she had envisioned Casa de Gloria in her dream. As she and her family walked in she was surprised to

discover that Pat and Karen were the pastors in her dream. Excitement is in the air and Casa de Gloria is preparing for the multitude as proclaimed by several prophecies.



TAKING IT TO THE STREETS

We loaded up with sandwiches, coffee, and tracts and headed to the streets of San Andres in search of the alcoholic groups who congregate on Saturday mornings all throughout town. Everywhere we went we were accepted and respected by these men on the street. Many have lost families due to their alcoholic vice. One man died from long term alcohol use, a few days after our visit. A handful have graced our

doors in Casa de Gloria, while others refuse to believe they have a problem. This year we are taking them to the throne room in prayer by



name; and calling for their salvation, health and the restoration of their families. We aim to see long lasting fruit this year from the Street Ministry. We want to see these men and their families serving the Lord and proclaiming His goodness to others!

FAMILIES ADOPTED LOCALLY AND ABROAD

Casa de Gloria is sowing seed into local and foreign soil this year. We are supporting a persecuted family in the 10/40 Window. And on a local level, we have chosen to adopt the family of Manuel. This family of 10 lives minutes from downtown San Andres Tuxtla.

They have no electricity or running water in their home. Manuel has lived his whole life in

his bed in his dirt floor wood frame home. He loves to read, listen to music and the news on his radio powered by a car battery. We hope, as a church, to visit them periodically throughout the year providing them with food, toiletries and bible studies. When we found out that he didn't own any Christian music; we made up a small CD album of a variety of music from the lending library for his listening pleasure.

SISTERS NEED ASSISTANCE

We have known Leidy and Ruth for many years now. When Ruth was born, she came to stay with us for a few days while a Cleft Palette Health clinic was in town. Pat had the honor of naming infant Ruth at this time. Their story is heart wrenching. They were born to a

blind mother and an illiterate fisher-

man father. Leidy, age 10, has an enlarged heart and is need of an operation ASAP. Her activities are kept to a minimal. She is her mother's eyes and has helped to raise her little sister. Ruth had to pass many opportunities to have corrective surgery due to her sickly nature. She has been in and out of hospitals for numerous reasons since her birth. The day this picture was taken we had given her a ride home from a 15 day stay in the Civil hospital for a strangely enlarged and swollen leg. Two Barra. years ago, she had her first

surgery to close the gap in her lip and Leidy hardly complains of the constant pain in her chest nose. She was turned down from entering Kindergarten because she isn't
