We plan to be stateside the end of September, all of October and the first week of November if anyone would like us to share our vision or to discuss how you can get involved in this worthy project. Now would be a great and strategic time to sow into the ministry God has given us here in San Andres Tuxtla, Veracruz, Mexico! Our downtown location will always be our Mother church base from which we operate, receive an infilling from and send people forth for the outpouring as we continue to plant more churches in and around San Andres.

We believe it is God's will for Casa de Gloria to remain in the downtown area of town where property is priced ridiculously high; contrary to the concept that Mexico is a cheap place to live. Pictured are two views of the reception hall we desire to buy. This reception hall is ideally and centrically located with plenty of public transportation at its doorsteps (bus and taxis). It is a corner lot, completely walled in for protection, comes equipped with chairs, tables, and a license to legally rent the building to large groups like wedding and XV Birthday receptions. Which would help generate the funds to maintain the upkeep of the building. It is also something we can move into right away with little or no renovation and hold our services. It has plenty of room for all our current activities such as the Public Lending Library, Clothing Bank, International Curriculum Video Bible School, English classes, Sunday morning services, Youth Group and Sunday school classes and so much more. The owner of the property in question is asking \$2 Million Pesos for the hall but our negotiator seems to believe he MAY accept an offer of \$1 \(\frac{1}{2}\) Million pesos; paying \(\frac{1}{2}\) now and the other ½ within the year. (The conversion rate at present is 13-1 = approx. \$120,000 DOLLARS) This appears to be a good deal although our problem at the moment is that we cannot negotiate since we don't have the funds to back up our offer. We truly believe time is of the essence and we need to act upon this now!

Won't you please prayerfully consider helping us obtain this building for our New Missions Headquarters? It really has the potential to be a great Missions Headquarters!
