WATCHMAN PRAYER MINISTRY TEAM VISITS SAN ANDRES TUXTLA

Pastor Phil Bennett of Concord First Assembly of God Church in Concord, NC, along with Pastors Allen and Doris Tyndale and Hans Woerner were truly a blessing as they came to teach us the importance of praying with the unity of the body of Christ. Pastor Phil travels extensively throughout the nations sharing the vision of the Watchman Prayer Ministry which help to establish a 24 hour prayer perimeter around your city. We first all met to prayerfully break down spiritual strongholds in our region. We met in the mornings at Casa de Gloria to pray as a group and allow God to guide us where and what order of events we needed to follow. It was revealed to the team of prayer warriors, the exact loca-

In our nightly meetings, we saw God touch the lives of many. One young boy boldly stood up and testified with such

confidence that God had healed his heart on the previous night. His sure fire way of sharing God's healing touch, spoke volumes to many who listened intently. Two nightly meetings were held and a Wall of Watchman with 24 hour prayer coverage was established for San Andres Tuxtla with 12 local Churches participating! Dec. 1st we officially began praying on the Wall as ONE body of believers, a first time for San Andres Tuxtla. Glory to God in the Highest!

400 BELIEVERS COME TOGETHER IN UNITY

In 1999, when the Lord first moved us to San Andres Tuxtla, He spoke to us that He would use us to unite the body of Christ here. At that time, Pat was working with the area churches within a 2 hour radius evangelizing 6 days a week with the film ministry showing movies on the mega screen in all the little communities. When we would mention that we would like to unite the churches together, the typical response would always be, "Oh, we don't work with other churches." That was over 6 years ago and today we can see through God's mercy and goodness, the walls that have divided the churches for generations are crumbling. Almost three years ago we began with 4 churches whose Pastors were open and

willing to work together to help further the Kingdom of God. Together we hosted Kingdom Conqueror Conferences with much success. This month, Pastor Phil Bennett, representative of the Watchman Prayer Ministry, and his team came in from N.C. to help us establish a 24 hour, 7 day a week, unified prayer wall in our city. The idea is for the Christ Bride to come together to pray forming a weapon that will prosper against the enemy. And since prayer has always been the catalyst for revivals to take place, we are excited about what God is doing in our area. Results? Ten area churches came together this month and decided to plan their events for 2006 incorporating

2. Looking for like new/nearly garage sale items to put in our Mobile Bazaar to bring them back with us in April 2006. The proceeds of the Bazaar will help us purchase a larger facility.
