about 10 feet tall once they stand inside their creations. The arms swing freely from side to side as they dance through the streets trying to hit the onlookers. No one seems to know exactly why the tradition continues or how it really started but they all agree it's roots are

from Spain and indigenous to this region of Veracruz. Through all the festivities, Christ is not seen or mentioned here. For even the


