We have finally anchored the Happier Bus/camper to its fixed location in a community within the city limits of San Andres. The water was the first thing to be connected. Then the men of Casa de Gloria worked on a shovel (Mexican Backhoe) daily on the

septic tank in the corner of the property from 6 AM until the hot sun beamed down on them at mid-day. Pastor Mike Patterson and Brian Hover from our home church of over 22 years, Grace Harbor Family Church in Covington, LA., came to lend a hand on the raising of the drop roof at our new Humanitarian Help Center. Once erected, the church members went door to door inviting the community to a simple get-together under the new roof. We had over 125 people in attendance not including the church members.
