Through Toils and Snares: Don't Fall for the Devil's Honeypot Witness 1

The Christian finds himself in this world seemingly alone without a leg to stand on. Human history is replete with examples of cultures or civilizations violently defending themselves, and history itself is, for the most part, just a record of increasingly bloody conflicts. Even back then it was still true - if it bleeds, it leads.

However, here we are in the Dispensationalist era of Christ, in which we comprise his body here on Earth. How should we conduct ourselves in this world so that we are in the world, but not of the world?

I had a debate the other day with a guy who thinks God is really the Devil. This is, essentially, a distillation of an old, esoteric Gnostic belief that Yahweh is either Satan or the Demiurge, and thus, the Bible is some sort of trick to capture the gullible into unknowingly lending psychic energy to an <u>egregore</u>, an <u>occult</u> concept representing a <u>non-physical entity</u> that arises from the collective thoughts of a distinct group of people.

However, this belief is critically, egregiously flawed - it's intellectually bankrupt, lacks plausibility and doesn't provide sufficient explanatory scope. I will discuss this belief more at the end of this writing. Essentially, the reason people fall for this spiritually lethal deception is because they get so caught up in a few little things from the Old Testament and twist them to try to make God out to be some evil person.

Let me guess - the Genocide of the Amalakites, the favorite verses of any well-heeled Bible critic:

I Samuel 15: 3

Now go, attack the Amalekites and totally destroy all that belongs to them. Do not spare them; put to death men and women, children and infants, cattle and sheep, camels and donkeys.

Now, let's consider this verse. At first glance, it seems bad, I mean *killing* women and infants *without mercy*? A first-glance, elementary reading of this verse makes God sound worse even than the Godfather. However, there's something that every examination of these verses misses - the inside information given by Joshua that this ethnic group contained the remnants of the fallen angel Nephilim seed.

Numbers 13: 33

And there we saw the Nephilim, the sons of Anak, who come of the Nephilim: and we were in our own sight as grasshoppers, and so we were in their sight.

So, as usual, there's more going on to the story than simply wanton destruction and genocide. When Joshua says "the sons of Anak", he is referring to the Amalekites, who were killed as part of his cleansing of the Holy Land. Another thing people often don't point out is that the Jews didn't even have it in them to follow these commandments, and failed to carry out the ordered genocide to completion anyways. In our other writings, we covered why it was necessary for God to wipe out this Satanic, fallen angel bloodline, which was the same reason for Noah's flood.

Of course, that doesn't stop people like Richard Dawkins and Bart Erhman <u>citing them</u> as a way to attack the character of God, leading countless numbers of people, like the person I was debating with, down a path leading straight to hell.

This is just one example, but it demonstrates an important fact - any exegesis of the Bible that twists its literal interpretation is more ad hoc, lacks plausibility, and has no explanatory scope compared to taking the original meaning as is. **If you have to write the Devil into God's character to read your Bible, you're doing it wrong.**

That being said, this does sum up exactly what I mean about being in a different dispensation - we just can't go around killing everybody, being angry, and taking revenge on people or using violence to achieve our goals anymore, like they did in the time of Moses and Joshua.

Remember, at this point in time God was literally living amongst the people in a pillar of fire and smoke:

The pillars of fire and cloud are a dual <u>theophany</u> (manifestation of God) described in various places in the first five books of the <u>Hebrew Bible</u>. The pillars are said to have guided the <u>Israelites</u> through the desert during <u>the Exodus</u> from <u>Egypt</u>. The pillar of cloud provided a visible guide for the Israelites during the day, while the pillar of fire lit their way by night.

They also had the Ark of the Covenant, visible in the image, which was once <u>captured by the Philistines</u>:

In Ashdod, when the Ark was placed in the temple of <u>Dagon</u>, the statue of Dagon was found <u>prostrate</u> in front of the Ark the next morning; after the statue of Dagon was restored to its place, it was again found prostrate the next morning, and this time its head and hands had also been broken off.

The ark brings about plagues, humbles the gods of the Philistines and returns full of treasure. On the advice of their <u>diviners</u> about how to end the plagues, the Philistines made a guilt offering of five golden <u>tumors</u> and five gold <u>mice</u> (representing the five Philistine rulers).

Basically, according to the Bible, the Philistines captured the Ark, the most sacred relic of Israel, and brought it back shortly afterward due to the supernatural activity and plagues it brought upon them. So, what I'm saying is that these people had an intimate, personal relationship with God the same way you or I do with the neighbor down the street.

God was physically manifested on Earth at this time and was as physically real to the Ancient Israelites as the wind, the sun, or the rain. It's like Sodom and Gomorrah, in those days God would just personally destroy cities of people he doesn't like. And that's perfectly fine for him to do so.

Now, these people really existed. These manuscripts are reliable, and in our other work we present conclusive, undeniable, and irrefutable proof that the Bible is supernaturally authored and divinely inspired, and thus, there are many good reasons to base an ontological worldview upon it. The story of the Ark, King David, King Solomon, the Temple they built, and the artifacts within are not simply mythology, no matter how desperately the materialists want them to stay there.

Tel Dan Inscription

One of the most notable modern Biblical archeological finds is the Tel Dan inscription, discovered in 1993 and dating to the 9th century BC. According to the LA Times in 1993, "The tablet is not only the first corroboration of that epic battle, described in I Kings, but it is also the first mention outside the Bible of the House of David, and thus of King David himself." The writing mentioning King David is marked white in the picture.



Mesha Stele

The Mesha Stele is the most extensive inscription ever found that refers to the ancient Kingdom of Israel. The stone contains a 34-line inscription celebrating the Moabite vassal king Mesha's rebellion against the Israelites. In addition, although there is some dispute on this, epigrapher André Lemaire identified in line 31 of the ninth-century B.C.E. stele the phrase דו]ד[ד] (bt[d]wd), or "House of David." Furthermore, the name of Omri, a king of Israel, is recorded on this inscription, and it is the earliest extra-biblical reference to Yahweh.



Like the story of Christ, there is solid rational reasoning to think that the Bible is the verifiable, trustworthy Word of God, and archeological discoveries confirm this time and time again.

In fact, there's never been an archeological discovery that contradicts the Biblical narrative in any way, and there's not a single real scholar, academic, or historian that actually thinks that Jesus didn't exist as a human being who suffered crucifixion under Pontius Pilate.

Solomon's temple really existed, and these artifacts were within it. What is the truth about them, and did they have the supernatural powers that the Bible claims? Only you can decide for yourself what you believe - no matter how much evidence I put up on this site that the Bible is reliable, divinely inspired, and true, there will always be some that don't listen, or some that come up with their own wild exegesis and reinterpretation of the Bible based off whatever internet video is currently trending.

But one thing is certain - God's nature is Goodness itself, and this is revealed over and over again. You don't need me to tell you why, "his invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse."

God had to carve out a place for Israel. Every single action of His in the Bible was justified, including wars and the destruction of cities and populations. Indeed, without divine intervention, Israel would not exist, the Bible would not exist, and we would be talking about something completely different. Silent Weapons for a Quiet War

In 1954 it was well recognized by those in positions of authority that it was only a matter of time, only a few decades, before the general public would be able to grasp and upset the cradle of power, for the very elements of the new silent-weapon technology were as accessible for a public utopia as they were for providing a private utopia. The issue of primary concern, that of dominance, revolved around the subject of the energy sciences.

The public cannot comprehend this weapon, and therefore cannot believe that they are being attacked and subdued by a weapon. The public might instinctively feel that something is wrong, but that is because of the technical nature of the silent weapon, they cannot express their feeling in a rational way, or handle the problem with intelligence. Therefore, they do not know how to cry for help, and do not know how to associate with others to defend themselves against it.

When a silent weapon is applied gradually, the public adjusts/adapts to its presence and learns to tolerate its encroachment on their lives until the pressure (psychological via economic) becomes too great and they crack up.

This year, U.S. arrests along the Mexican border <u>topped 2 million in a single year</u>. Now, this is simply part of a long-term, many-faceted, thoroughly planned-out, controlled demolition of western society. All of this around us - the chaos in the government, the psychotic lies of the media, and the overwhelming failure of every system that we rely on, is completely unsustainable, and it will all collapse in a day.

Much of our other writing focuses on this conspiracy, and 9/11 is the most explicit and overt example of it. <u>Silent Weapons for a Quiet War</u>, quoted above, is a good read for anyone unfamiliar with this concept.

However, one thing we must keep in mind is that Christian theology trumps everything else, even to the point where we might have to stand by and watch our country and our people suffer. Well, if you want the privileges of being Christian, such as an easier judgement and salvation based solely on faith, this is one of the sacrifices you must make inside the third temple – your body. You must renounce violence and revenge in a way that few others did throughout history, even when it is totally justified, like when your government has been taken over by explicitly Satanic pedophiles who broadcast their plans to subjugate and destroy your people every day.

God wants us to focus on the spiritual world, our souls, and what comes after, not worry about political kingdoms or countries on Earth. Not simply saying or thinking a bad word about Jesus, but effectively saying – and spreading the claim – that his ministry is of the devil because he is empowered by an evil spirit.

This is exactly what these people are doing. Jesus said, "I and the Father are one", he quoted from the Old Testament scriptures, and he read and knew them by heart. Jesus, like all Jews at the time, understood the Old Testament quite well and believed in it 100%.

If you came around at that time and started saying that their God, Jesus' Father, is really the devil, they would have killed you for blasphemy. Jesus himself would utterly reject you, because you reject the Father. Let me be perfectly clear: Anyone that thinks this is *not* a Christian. They are a blasphemer and a heretic, and the things that they think are literally demonic and evil.

A big part of blasphemy is ascribing to the Devil what only God can do - like the miracles in the Old Testament. Satan does not have the power to, for example, send the angel of death to kill all the Egyptian's firstborn sons. Only God can do that, and saying that Satan can is LITERALLY blasphemy. There are so many other good arguments against this theory that I don't even have time to write them all out.

What people are doing by subscribing to this exegesis is placing their morality above God's. They're saying, "I don't like (x thing that God does in the Old Testament), so it must have been Satan." By doing so, they're saying that they know right and wrong better than God, or that there is no possible way God has morally sufficient reasons for doing (x thing).

Again, literally blasphemy. Putting yourself above God. Now, I'm not sure where this idea even came from or who could possibly believe something so ridiculous, but I figured this would help anyone struggling with their Theology in this way.
