Why Does Funding Matter?

Funding helps bring your ideas to life. Whether you're building a robot, hosting a STEAM Night, or launching a community project, strong funding makes everything possible. Learning how to find and request funding is part of becoming a strong advocate and leader.

What Can Funding Can Help You Do?

- Build prototypes & test ideas
- Start or expand a STEAM club
- Buy materials & equipment
- Host STEAM events or competitions
- Bring in guest speakers or mentors
- Take field trips to museums or STEM workplaces
- Launch community STEAM projects

Types of Funding

Grants: Money you apply for to support a project.

Mini-Grants: Smaller awards (often \$50–\$500) that are may be easier to get.

Sponsorships: Support from local businesses or partners.

Crowdfunding: Raising funds online with help from your community.

School-Based Funding: PTA, district funds, principal support, or student government.

Local & Regional Funding Ideas

Think local! Many STEAM clubs find success by reaching out to nearby organizations.

- School district or foundation mini-grants
- PTO/PTA or parent association funds
- Local banks, tech companies, or engineering firms
- Public libraries, museums, or community centers
- Borough or city STEM initiatives (NYC, Queens, etc.)
- Local civic groups (Kiwanis, Rotary, Lions Club)

Creative Fundraising Ideas for STEAM Clubs

- STEM Night or Science Fair
- STEM Trivia or Bingo Night
- Escape Room or Puzzle Night
- Community Maker Faire
- Sell STEAM bracelets, stickers, or shirts
- Restaurant “STEAM Night” partnership
- Recycling drive to collect materials
- STEM Challenge Competition
- DonorsChoose or GoFundMe (teacher required)

Grant Application Tips

- Start early—deadlines come quickly.
- Tell a strong story: What problem are you solving?
- Show how students will benefit.
- Include realistic cost estimates.
- Ask a teacher or advisor to review.
- Keep everything organized in one folder.

- Snacks for STEAM events
- General project supplies (tape, markers, cardboard)
- Contingency for unexpected needs
