Forsyth County Businessman Carter Patterson Announces Candidacy for Georgia State Senate District 27

CUMMING, GA – [October 7, 2025] – Forsyth County businessman and conservative community leader Carter Patterson has announced his candidacy for Georgia State Senate District 27, pledging to bring *strong conservative leadership* and a *fresh, results-driven perspective* to the State Capitol. The seat, which encompasses much of Forsyth County, will be open in 2026 following Senator Greg Dolezal’s decision to run for Lieutenant Governor.

“As a lifelong Republican and proud Forsyth County resident, I believe it’s time for new conservative leadership that reflects the values of our community,” said Patterson. “I’m running to fight for Forsyth County families—lower taxes, improving traffic congestion, protecting the senior tax exemption, keeping our schools among the best the nation, fighting for the second amendment and standing strong with local and state law enforcement. The people of this county work hard, play by the rules, and deserve a state senator who will do the same.”

Patterson, a successful business owner and civic leader, enters the race as a political outsider focused on *limited government, fiscal discipline, and protecting Georgia’s conservative values from the radical left*. His campaign platform, “A Conservative Champion for Forsyth County’s Future,” emphasizes ten core priorities, including cutting taxes, strengthening schools, defending the unborn, supporting law enforcement, and improving transportation and infrastructure without raising taxes.

“Forsyth County is one of the most vibrant communities in Georgia, but we’re feeling the strain of rapid growth,” Patterson said. “From traffic congestion to rising property taxes, people are frustrated. I’ll bring real-world business experience and common-sense solutions to Atlanta to make sure Forsyth County continues to thrive.”

Patterson plans to run a strong grassroots campaign centered on neighborhood-level engagement—connecting personally with voters through homeowner associations, community gatherings, and local events. His campaign will focus on direct voter contact.

“As a first-time candidate, I’m not running for a title—I’m running to make a difference,” Patterson added. “I’ll fight to protect the conservative principles that have made Forsyth County and Georgia strong—faith, family, freedom, and fiscal responsibility.”

The Republican Primary Election will be held May 19, 2026.
