



## Contest Specific Rules:

### Tubby Fest 2024

A CompBBQUK Managed Contest

Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> April 2024

## **1. Introduction**

These rules cover attendance at, and participation in Tubby Fest 2024 taking place on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> April. Rules and regulations specific to taking part in either the SCA Steak Cookoff or CompBBQUK Champion Series Freestyle contest will be documented independently.

## **2. Name, Date and Location**

The overall event will be known as Tubby Fest and will take place on Saturday April 27<sup>th</sup>, 2024. The location for the contest will be Churcham Business Park, Churcham, Gloucester GL2 8AX.



### 3. Structure and Rounds

The overall contest is split in to two separate contests, firstly an SCA (Steak Cookoff Association) single round contest, secondly a three round CompBBQUK Champion Series Freestyle contest.

#### 3.1. SCA (Steak Cookoff Association) Contest

3.1.1. Contest will adhere to the official SCA rules and processes available on the SCA website [here](#):

#### 3.2. CompBBQUK Champion Series Contest

3.2.1. Contest will adhere to the official CompBBQUK Champion Series rules and processes.

##### 3.2.2. Round 1 – Burger

- Six identical burgers per entry.
- Entry must be submitted on a single serving platter and must be carried by a single person when turning in.
- Teams may interpret “burger” how they wish, but they must as a minimum consist of a main filling sandwiched between top and bottom outer.

##### 3.2.3. Round 2 – Bird

- Six identical portions, or a single item that can be portioned in to six identical pieces.
- Entry must be submitted on a single serving platter and must be carried by a single person when turning in.
- The main ingredient of the entry must derive from a bird.

##### 3.2.4. Round 3 – Banquet

- There must be six identical portions of any element that is single serving, or any single item must be able to be portioned in to six identical pieces.
- Entry must be submitted on a single serving platter and must be carried by a single person when turning in.
- Teams may interpret “banquet” how they wish both in terms of content of the entry and presentation.

#### 3.3. Combined Timelines

- 09:00 – 09:15 Cooks meeting / SCA Steak Selection
- 10:30 - 11:00 Judges Registration SCA and CompBBQUK
- 11:00 – 11:15 Judges Meeting
- 12:00 - 12:30 **SCA Steak Turn In**
- 13:30 - 14:00 **CompBBQUK Freestyle R1 Turn In (Burger)**
- 14:45 - 15:15 **CompBBQUK Freestyle R2 Turn In (Bird)**
- 16:00 - 16:30 **CompBBQUK Freestyle R3 Turn In (Banquet)**
- 17:30 – 17:50 Awards - Stage



#### **4. Standard Contest Rules**

- 4.1. All cooking for CompBBQUK Champion Series rounds must take place on barbecues / smokers that derive their heat source from burning solid natural fuels (charcoal, wood, or pellets). SCA rules allows gas only for the SCA contest.
- 4.2. All cooking must take place at the location of the contest, within allotted timeframes of the contest and in accordance with the rules and regulations of each contest.
- 4.3. Cooks and teams must ensure that all preparation and cooking is done in hygienic and sanitary conditions.
- 4.4. Teams can consist of 1 – 3 named individuals with one team member designated the head cook who is considered responsible for the team during the event.
- 4.5. Teams are not permitted to share the use of barbecues, smokers, or team areas during the contests.
- 4.6. Each team will be permitted a single entry and in accordance with the requirements for each round laid out within the rules of the respective contests.

#### **5. Local Rules**

- 5.1. Arrival: Friday 26th 6pm – 8 pm, Saturday 27th 7am – 9am. Teams are not permitted to remain on site overnight on Friday.
- 5.2. Teams are responsible for providing or sourcing all of their own equipment, the event will not be providing equipment unless previously agreed.
- 5.3. It is a condition of the event (as with both CompBBQUK and SCA) that all teams have a suitable fire extinguisher and fire blanket easily accessible in their team area.
- 5.4. All hot ash and embers must be disposed of in the designated bins provided.
- 5.5. All recycling and refuse must be disposed of in the provided locations or taken off site.
- 5.6. Every care must be taken not to damage the ground or environment of the contest location. You must leave your team, contest area and event location as you found it.
- 5.7. The event takes place on a working commercial estate where some of the businesses are in operation over the weekend, you must not impede, hinder, or disrupt these businesses.
