


Christopher Wyze – Live In Clarksdale – Big Radio Records



Christopher Wyze neatly combines the world of his imagination with the essence of the blues. The singer took an interesting look at the tradition of the music of the South and the Mississippi Delta. The live album "Live In Clarksdale" was recorded in the legendary Clarksdale, Mississippi for a reason. For this concept, he prepared a performance perfectly suited to the style of the South, which was recorded by Johnny Phillips, co-owner of Selecto-Hits and head of Big Radio Records.

Big Radio Records is a record label in Memphis that releases the highly successful "Select-O-Hits" sets. The latest "Live.In.Clarksdale" contains a CD+DVD set, recordings of an extraordinary concert presented by the American blues band Christopher Wyze and his band The Tellers. The album is accompanied by video materials: a live concert and a 50-minute documentary "Wyze in Clarkdale". In the film, Christopher Wyze travels to places, people and history, the birthplace and homeland of the blues. "It's hard to find a more iconic blues place to play our music," says Christopher Wyze. This is where Christone "Kingfish" Ingram, Charlie Musselwhite, and the North Mississippi Ali Stars performed, in the concert hall's famous Joint Chapel at the iconic Shack Up Inn in Clarksdale." Live In. Clarksdale contains mostly blues songs from Roots Music Report's debut album

from **Christopher Wyze & The Tellers'** debut album. "How Long, How Long Blues and Nobody Knows You When You're Down and Out," explains Ch. Wyze, "Carr and Blackwell recorded in a hotel room in Indianapolis. It is also the place where these two had their homes and were buried. Their stories are of particular importance to the team. Indianapolis is home to me and the two Tellers. It just seemed right to record the two best songs of Leroy Carr and Scrapper Blackwell. I was a little emotional on stage."

"Live.In.Clarksdale" is the band's second album released by Big Radio Records in just nine months. Their debut album, "Stuck in the Mud", earned "Back to Clarksdale", a No. 1 blues single, and the album appeared on the "Top 200 Blues Album Chart for 2024". Now comes a special live version of **Christopher Wyze & The Tellers**' surprising debut.
