There being a quorum, Mayor Penrod called the meeting of the Vienna City Council to order at 6:30 p.m.

NEW BUSINESS

Alderman Racey made a motion to Authorize and Approve the Omnibus Consent Agenda consisting of May 6, 2026 Meeting Minutes, April Treasurer Report and the Warrant (\$82,335.63) Alderman Hill seconded the motion. All present in favor, motion carried.

Alderman Pitts made a motion to Authorize and Approve to accept Horner & Shifrin as consulting engineer for the 2026 calendar year to perform MFT. Seconded by Alderman Tuey. All present in favor, motion carried.

Mayor Penrod reviewed the estimated cost of maintenance for MFT expenditures totaling \$74,502.69.

Alderman Hill made a motion to Authorize and Approve Resolution 26-05, A Resolution for Maintenance of Street and Highways by the Municipality under the Highway Code for \$75,000.00 of MFT Funds. Seconded by Alderman Tuey. All present in favor, motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Adam Shoemaker, local business owner, addressed the council concerning placement of his commercial dumpster and requested permission to relocate it to the east side of the building for various reasons. Council would consider the request.

Richard Owen addressed the council of parking concerns at the youth league soccer field and presented an idea for expanding the parking area. The council would take the proposal under consideration.

ELECTED/APPOINTED OFFICIALS

Wright announced a reminder for the Shawnee Mass Transit anniversary celebration the following day. Wright stated that liquor license renewals notices would be sent out. Wright also gave a brief update regarding the city's audit noting it was underway. Wright also announced the Memorial Day Service at the city library.

Alderman Racey discussed parking needs for the annual 100 mile run event, including the potential use of another parking lot and future grant opportunities for a new parking area at the city park.

Mayor Penrod said the water tower project was almost completed, stating the water tower was being refilled. A brief update was given on the water line project along Hwy 146. Penrod also discussed contacting the city attorney concerning utility shut offs for unpaid property citations.

Penrod announced the city had been selected for project funding through a Safe Routes To School grant in the amount of \$249,400.00. Projects include improvement of an existing crosswalk at the intersection of Highway 146 and Third Street and new sidewalks along Fourth Street from Second Street to the high school.

As there was no further business to discuss, Alderman Moore made a motion to adjourn. Seconded by Alderman Tuey. Mayor Penrod declared the meeting adjourned at 7:10 p.m.
