There being a quorum, Mayor Penrod called the meeting of the Vienna City Council to order at 6:30 p.m.

**NEW BUSINESS**

Alderman Tuey made a motion to Authorize and Approve the Omnibus Consent Agenda consisting of March 4, 2026 Meeting Minutes, the Warrant (\$19,098.46) and February Treasurer Report. Alderman Hill seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

Mayor Penrod said no bids were received for the 2011 Ford F150.

Mayor Penrod opened bids for a 1984 Case Front End Loader as follows:

George Haden-\$7,500.00

Brandon King-\$4,759.00

Paul Colson-\$833.33, 3-lg family pizzas,6-Ned's cheeseburgers, and \$33 worth of Dogecoin

Bill Bass- \$3,100.00

Alderman Racey made a motion to accept the high bid from George Haden in the amount of \$7,500.00. Seconded by Tuey. All in favor, motion carried.

Alderman Hill made a motion to Authorize and Approve the purchase of 4- thermal printers and accessories from Rugged Mobile Technology for police patrol vehicles in the amount of \$2,895.49 (General Funds). Alderman Pitts seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

Alderman Moore made a motion to Authorize and Approve bid from American Patriot Pyro for the 2026 fireworks display (show date-Friday, July 3) in the amount of \$15,005.45 (General/Tourism Funds) Alderman Elliott seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

**PUBLIC COMMENT**

Josef Huckelberry was present and questioned the status of the investigation on the 4-way disturbance that occurred February 18. Penrod informed that the investigation was still ongoing.

**ELECTED/APPOINTED OFFICIALS**

Wright said the spring cleanup was scheduled for Monday, April 27. The city would put out an “all text” to residents including a reminder to pull trashcans from the curb within 24 hours of trash pickup. Wright said Johnson County 2000 would be re-installing their sign that was removed during construction along 146 East/Industrial Drive.

Mayor Penrod said the city welcome sign was completed and would be installed soon.


Penrod said the watermain project would begin March 30 on the north side of 146.

Penrod said he had a discussion with the city TIF administrator on proposed housing development along Veterans Drive. He said a conference call was scheduled for Friday that will include the builder. Brief discussion was had on the sewer system improvements for this project. Penrod said the city would utilize TIF Funds for the sewer improvements.

Penrod said the city received invoices for bond attorney fees concerning the water project loan/grant.

As there was no further business to discuss, Alderman Tuey made a motion to adjourn. Seconded by Alderman Hill. Mayor Penrod declared the meeting adjourned at 6:51 p.m.
