

#### From Kellee Casebeer:

On 3/7, we read a book Maxi the Taxi and then the children wrote letters to a friend or parent telling why they liked the book. When they finished their letter, they were each allowed to select three new books to take home for Spring Break. The books were made available from our 500 book grant to the school.

On 3/21, we made Cat in the Hat parfaits. First, we read the Cat in the Hat; and then, we made parfaits. The purpose was to have the children learn that reading has practical value. They had to read a recipe, make a shopping list, shop in our Cat in the Hat store, and then make their parfaits. The best part was that the word "parfait" was never before in their vocabulary. We added it as a word the following week as part of the Reading Carnival, and every one of them was able to read that word.

On 3/28, we did our Reading Carnival. This was the second time this group of 2nd graders had done the carnival, and it was clear that they had greatly improved from the Fall Read > Lead > Achieve event. One of the cutest aspects of Ms. Petry's students is that they panic when they find out that they don't need to be in special reading anymore. Their first question is always, but can I still go the library when the Pi Phis come???

#### From Jennifer Bohannon:

Our Spring CAR Progam was a tremendous success. We worked with Mrs. Petry's Reading Class at Morningside Elementary School in Fort Worth. A dedicated group of Southlake Pi Beta Phi Alumni attended the program for three Mondays during the month of March. The program started with Jennifer and her reading buddy, Cassandra, reading "The Adventures of Taxi Dog," or as we refer to it, "Maxi the Taxi" to the class. The students then wrote letters to a friend telling them about this book.

Week Two was a real highlight with students using their reading skills to read a recipe and prepare a "Cat in the Hat" sundae using fresh strawberries and whipped cream. Many thanks to the librarian for allowing this activity to take place in her library!

The grand finale was the Reading Carnival! Students went through six stations, playing reading games. At this event, each student was allowed to select three books that had been given to the school as part of the Pi Beta Phi Book Grant. It was a day full of fun and excitement and the students were thrilled to have their own books as prizes.

#### From Jennifer Bohannon:

The Fraternity Day of Service was held at Morningside Elementary, Wednesday, September 28th. Mrs. Petry's second grade readers were treated to a "Reading Carnival". Pi Phi alumni, along with two collegians from the UNT campus (Sarah Coffen and Amadi Taylor) and four academic leaders from Morningside's fifth grade class made bookmarks, played games and had a great time reading and interacting. We promised the students that we would return in the spring, if they listened to Mrs. Petry, worked hard and kept reading.

#### From Kellee Casebeer:

Our Reading Carnival was the Southlake Club's activity for September which is Read>Lead>Achieve Month for Pi Beta Phi.

I designed the carnival after the school carnival I attended when I was a kid, and then just retooled the games to be "literacy centric". Other game ideas I pulled off of Pinterest. I took my game proposals to Ms. Petry to see which she believed would work, and then just started making them. My adorable neighbor Sophia, who is 10 years old, drew the designs for me for the Go Fish game, after I sketched something she said looked like a five year old drew. Together, she and I then converted her drawings to scale, and made what you see now as our Go Fish backdrops. After all of the games were made, I tested them on Sophia, and her 7 year old sister Abigial. Then, tweaked them one more times based on their feedback.

The really impressive part was that the kids had a fantastic time. They had almost two full hours of carnival time and they were fully engaged. I don't think it ever crossed their minds that they were learning and improving their reading skills.











#### Pi Beta Phi Book Grant

Each year Pi Phi offers 100 500 book grants to chapters and clubs. The SAAC has been awarded three book grants to date. Kellee Casebeer applied for Morningside Elementary School on behalf of Southlake Club in 2013 for our first grant which was awarded in 2014. She along with about 10 other Pi Phi's delivered the books to Morningside Elementary School as part of our CAR program. In 2015, Kellee Casebeer applied for a 2016 grant. Again, SAAC was selected, and we delivered the 500 free books from Pi Beta Phi and First Book. An additional 250+ books that had been collected and donated by Brandon Cantrell were also delivered. This year, Jennifer Bohannon applied for the grant and once again SAAC was selected. The books will be made available in February 2017 for delivery in March as part of Fraternity Day of Service 2017. Ms. Petry will be able to select from First Book exactly which books are appropriate for her readers, and the books will be used to facilitate home libraries for her students.

#### **Tutoring at Morningside Elementary School and other local schools**

From Kellee Casebeer:

I have been tutoring the same little girl since March 2014. For me it is about utilizing the Power of Pi Phi to change one life. For nothing more than a couple hours a week, I may be able to make opportunities in this little girl's life happen because she can now read and enjoys school. Before my student transferred to another school (I followed her to the new school), I also truly enjoyed the

sisterhood time with Jenn and her student. The four of us were just a group of girls having fun while we studying together.
