THE ALLIANCE - CLEAR CREEK

The Alliance – Clear Creek has been serving the Clear Creek ISD Community since 2003. This coalition participates in Medication Take Backs twice a year, distributes medication disposal pouches, collaborates with local city officials and police departments to affect environmental change, and participates in community outreach activities to provide information, resources, and tools. The coalition moved to quarterly meetings this year and will continue to do so in 2024!



With a rise in fentanyl-related poisonings, the Alliance-Clear Creek worked on strategies to **bring about lasting environmental changes** and ultimately save lives.

CCISD NURSE PARTNERSHIP

In conversations with CCISD Lead Nurses, several needs were identified, and the Alliance has enjoyed being part of **meeting those needs** this school year. In late summer, the Alliance partnered with local ladies' boutiques to hold a period poverty drive to gather feminine hygeine supplies for nurses' clinics. Also, as part of UTMB's training for CCISD nurses, we identified that nurses needed to be outfitted with "go bags" that would contain everything they might need for an opioid overdose or fentanyl poisoning.

SALSA Student Adult Leadership Service Alliance

SALSA, an initiative under our youth prevention efforts, is a leadership program founded by the Alliance in 2014. It pairs youth with community adults to promote active community involvement, offers **equal voice** to both groups, and addresses various risk factors such as substance abuse and mental health disparities during the transition to adulthood.







SALSA students spearhead school-wide activities on campus during Red Ribbon Week and Love Above Week, as well as attend Clear Creek Coalition meetings.

FISDCARES

The Alliance formed an official partnership in September 2019 to serve Friendswood ISD. The initiative, now known as FISDCares, includes a **joint collaboration with Friendswood ISD and the Alliance helping families through challenging times**. This initiative addresses the tangible needs of students and their families such as assistance with rent, food, clothing, and childcare. **Currently there are 47 families and 107 students on the FISDCares caseload.**



In March 2024, the Alliance "rebooted" its community coalition in Friendswood by hosting Coffee and Conversation with over 80 attendees to focus on how to work together to impact the lives of students and families in FISD.













FISDCares projects Mustang Ready and Mustang Santa offer the families on our caseload back-to-school support and holiday assistance, respectively. For the 23-24 school year, **Mustang Ready provided 64 students** with a name brand backpack and their campus recommended school supplies, while **Mustang Santa** provided over **526 gifts**, including socks, underwear, pajamas, and hygiene supplies to **81 students**.

NEW DEVELOPMENTS

- In 2023, a group of passionate community stakeholders formed our FISDCares Advisory Committee. This group has been critical in the expansion of FISDCares in the community.
- Mustangs In Motion is a new project created to provide students on our caseload with the opportunity to participate in extracurricular activites. We are grateful for our partnerships with Chara Christian Dance Academy, Be Someone Sports, Sharks Swim Club, Colts and Broncos Football, and FISD Community Ed on this exciting initiative!

FRIENDSWOOD BLESSING BOX

In 2021, a team of Girl Scouts created a Blessing Box which offered non-perishable foods and other supplies for the Friendswood community. Their slogan of "give what you can and take what you need" provided families in need with a place to discreetly obtain pantry items during difficult times. They asked the Alliance to serve as a community partner to provide for upkeep and maintenance.

Due to the popularity of the current box, we are excited to announce that we are in the process of adding **2 new Blessing Box locations in Friendswood** - Westwood/Bales and Friendswood Library.

CURRICULUM-BASED SUPPORT GROUPS®

Alliance staff facilitate the Curriculum-Based Support Group® (CBSG) Program, developed by Rainbow Days, an evidence-based preventive intervention aimed at students aged 4-17 facing high-risk situations. The program fosters essential life skills through confidential, small group sessions, reducing anti-social behavior and substance use while enhancing coping and social skills.

POSITIVE ALTERNATIVES

Positive Alternatives provide fun, challenging, and structured activities with supervision, so people have constructive and **healthy ways to enjoy free time** and learn new skills. These alcohol and drugfree activities help people, particularly young people, stay away from situations that encourage the use of alcohol, tobacco, or other drugs.

PROM

Prom provides students an opportunity to bond with their peers and their school community. The Alliance partnered with Clear View High School to plan, organize, and decorate for a "Midnight Masquerade" themed prom. Students and staff loved the decorations and had a memorable evening!

MENTAL HEALTH FAIRS

The Alliance was invited to participate in Mental Health Fairs at Friendswood High School and Clear Horizons Early College High School.

The Alliance provided resources, handouts, and tools to aid in stress relief activities and build awareness of mental health issues.

PROJECT GRADUATION

Project Graduation is an opportunity for graduating seniors to celebrate their achievements with their classmates in a

safe, drug and alcoholfree environment. 2023 was the 10th year to host this event!



RED RIBBON WEEK

Red Ribbon Week honors the memory of Enrique "Kiki" Camarena, a Drug Enforcement Administration Agent who was kidnapped, tortured and murdered by a drug cartel in 1985. This year, the Alliance provided support to all CCISD elementary, intermediate, and high school campuses with their Red Ribbon Week activities with ribbons, bracelets, stickers, and more! Additionally, the Alliance gave Red Ribbon Week Presentations to several CCISD campuses including Whitcomb Elementary, Landolt Elementary, Westbrook Intermediate, and Clear Brook High School.

In partnership with SALSA, the **Alliance supports the** campus at Clear View for Red Ribbon Week festivities. This year's activities included a somber display of artists and musicians who have lost their lives to drugs and/or alcohol, a presentation on Fentanyl, a pumpkin decorating contest (judged by our Clear Creek Coalition members) and culminated in a lunchtime celebration of "It's Sweet to be Drug-Free" complete with a candy bar and a nacho bar.



LOVE ABOVE WEEK

Created by the Alliance in 2014, the Alliance has supported Clear View High School each February in their observance of Love Above Week, dedicated to prioritizing love over Drugs, Alcohol, Hate, Apathy, and Violence. This cherished tradition, marked by various activities throughout the week, concluded with the campus-wide sharing of notes of encouragement, promoting positivity, school connectedness, and a commitment to a drug-free life. This year's theme, "Donut Feel Good to Be Drug Free," resonated throughout the festivities, fostering a sense of unity and resilience among students and staff alike.

PRESENTATIONS

One of the primary focuses of the Alliance's prevention efforts is and continues to be on education. Educational presentations are aimed at increasing knowledge and changing attitudes. Presentation topics focus on substance use prevention and/or behavioral health promotion. The Alliance offers no-cost presentations to youth and adults in schools and in the community.

INDEPTH

(Intervention for Nicotine Dependence: Education, Prevention, Tobacco and Health)

Vaping's popularity grew from 2.1 million in 2017 to 3.6 million in 2018, prompting the U.S. Surgeon General to declare e-cigarette use among our youth an epidemic. INDEPTH helps schools and communities address the teen vaping problem in a more supportive way. INDEPTH is an interactive program, created by the American Lung Association, that teaches students about nicotine dependence, establishing healthy alternatives and how to kick the unhealthy addiction that got them in trouble in the first place.

During the 2023-2024 school year, the Alliance facilitated INDEPTH curriculum at Friendswood High School as part of their restorative discipline efforts. Looking ahead, the Alliance is excited to offer schools in CCISD and FISD a new INDEPTH ONLINE option to reach even more students.



Intervention for Nicotine **Dependence: Education, Prevention,** Tobacco and Health

WHO CAN TAKE THE COURSE?

 INDEPTH Online is offered to students who have violated school tobacco-free policies.

WHY INDEPTH ONLINE?

- The student can immediately start after the violation.
- The Alliance facilitator can monitor students' progress on the INDEPTH Online portal.
- It takes the student approximately 2 hours to complete.
- Students are required to complete all four modules. They must score at least an 80% on all knowledge checks in order to advance to the next module.

- Once completed, the will meet with the student in person to review the materials.
- After the review. the student will obtain a certificate

MEDICATION TAKE BACK

Since September of 2010, over **9,000 community members** have participated in **twenty-eight Medication Take Back events** coordinated by the Alliance in partnership with local law enforcement and the Drug Enforcement Administration. The Alliance hosted 4 sites in October of 2023, and 6 sites in April 2024.



Since 2010, the Alliance has partnered with the following law enforcement entities in our Medication Take Back Efforts

and have collectively disposed of over 36,000 pounds of unwanted, unused, or expired medications!

Both the City of Nassau Bay and the City of Kemah have Permanent Drop Box locations to demonstrate their ongoing commitment to the health and safety of residents in the Bay Area.

MEDICATION DISPOSAL POUCH DISTRIBUTION

In partnership with the University of Houston, the Alliance offers free Single Use Disposal Pouches (SUDS). These Disposal Pouches neutralize medication by placing pills, patches, and liquids inside and adding water. The pouch allows you to **safely dispose of unwanted**, **expired prescriptions & over-the-counter medications** in your household trash. This year the Alliance has acquired DisposeRx, an RX disposal system no bigger than a packet of sugar, available for those wishing to dispose of individual bottles of medication.

Disposal solutions are available by calling the Alliance office as well as offered at all coalition meetings. The Alliance is also working to create partnerships to distribute medication disposal options to realtors, hospice, assisted living facilities, and more.







ONE PILL CAN KILL

The Alliance has been very intentional this year in their efforts to educate the community about the **dangers of fentanyl.** From presentations to the General Membership Luncheon of the Clear Lake Area Chamber and the Space Center Rotary to informational tables at mental health fairs at local high schools, the Alliance has provided the facts about the clear and present danger of this deadly epidemic.
