## Coming Lent Series – "Jesus as Central"

This year for Lent, we will be focusing on a series called "Jesus as Central." In Colossians 1:15-20, Paul explains why Jesus holds the central place. The passage centers on Christ's supremacy—as the image of the invisible God, the creator and sustainer of everything, and the one who reconciles all creation through his sacrifice on the cross. These verses present a grand vision, highlighting Christ's ultimate power and authority over all things. This demonstrates the profound significance of Christ's work in mending the relationship between humanity and God and reveals how all parts of creation are

Why should Christ be first place in our lives? Why should He be first in our church, our community, and our nation? Because Christ is supreme, nothing else should distract us from him. We must get rid of anything that keeps us from glorifying Christ. Often in our lives, Christ is marginalized. He often isn't first: work, sports, hobbies, or family commonly takes first place. Paul gives us reasons why Christ should be first in our lives and in the entire world. He talks about how special Christ is and why he must be preeminent—first.

The intent in bringing this series is to have us realize that Jesus Christ must be the central focus of Sharon Mennonite Church. Jesus is why we come together each Sunday. Jesus is why we fellowship together and encourage one another. So often we tend to get distracted as a body of believers and Jesus becomes second place. This series during Lent will give us a chance to analyze and ask the question if Jesus Christ is central at Sharon. We will also be discussing each weekly theme of Jesus being central in our Sunday School classes each week.

Lent begins on February 22 and continues until Easter, April 5. Meghan Good will be here to bring the message on the first Sunday of Lent to talk about the Preeminence of Jesus. Below you will find the themes for each Sunday through Easter. I hope you are concerned about Sharon and that we can all be here to learn in this series. **Pastor Walter Campbell**


