Dan Milligan mentioned that he would like for the City Attorney to look into Ordinances for banning the feeding of wild animals/feral cats within City limits and asked if the sirens have been tested. Sirens were sounded over the weekend by Pulaski County due to severe weather but have not been officially tested. Council requests the sirens are tested monthly.

PUBLIC HEARING – WASTEWATER IMPROVEMENTS

The Public Hearing for Wastewater Improvements was held with input from the public. The Mayor went through the Community Needs Assessment with the public and received their opinions. The mayor went over the Resolution of the City of Dixon, Missouri, Stating Intent to Seek Funding Through the Community Development Block Grant Program and Authorizing the Mayor to Pursue Activities in an Attempt to Secure Funding (Resolution 2026-013). POLICE DEPARTMENT UPDATE: DODGE DURANGOS

It was agreed by the Council to table the Police Department Update regarding the Dodge Durangos.

DIXON NURSING HOME

Dan Milligan brought up the issue with the Nursing Home property being vacant almost a year and the property not being maintained. Assistant Chief Cottner informed the Council that he has already provided an abatement for that property and Public Works can now mow the property and forward a bill to the owner.

CITY CLERK UPDATE

Kelli Livengood reported that the mayor's office still leaks during heavy rains but the other places where water was coming in seem to be holding the water back. The water coming in from the front door during torrential rains was evaluated by the company who installed the doors, Dormakaba. The service tech explained that in order for the door to work properly, it must have a small gap but he did replace the rubber piece at the bottom which seems to help it a lot. Kelli also reported all brick and mortar business renewals from 2025 licenses have been renewed.

LIBRARY UPDATE

Lacey Teague reported that the Library has been busy since school let out with 29 kids signed up for the summer reading program. The community yard sale overall received great feedback from those who sold items and those who attended the sales. The Pulaski County Growth Alliance last month was a great meeting. Learning about what the Route 66 Committee is about along with the Pulaski County Tourism pulling in groups and giving them information for all over the county. Our representative for the Pulaski County Tourism is Vicki Bishop. The bid packets are almost done for the CDBG demo grant, they should be ready within the next few days. Lacey mentioned finding another grant through CDBG that she suggested we look into. It is for street improvements with no matching funds required.

POLICE UPDATE

Assistant Chief Cottner mentioned that the Durangos should be ready for pick up, at the earliest, in 30 days or up to 60 days. Abatements are going out for overgrown yards and other nuisances.

PUBLIC WORKS UPDATE

Nathan Cox reported that in May 2026, the department completed 28 work orders; one service leak; no sewer backups; water loss 26%; PW crew has been cleaning up the old shop and they are planning on having more items for surplus; May 2026, report sent to DNR; and the Bac-T samples for May were satisfactory.

Nathan and Vince presented bids for a new mini excavator that would be helpful for the projects that are coming up in the near future. Three different bids through GAHR Truck and Equipment with the best one being a lease for 60 months; 500 hours annually, 6.85% APR, sale price of \$73,920.00 with \$25,000.00 down (from Sewer/Water CD withdraw last month), monthly payments at \$979.83, upfront extended warranty of 7 years or 4,000 hours for an additional \$3,780.00, and purchase price at the end of the lease being \$1.00. Bobcat of Rolla, MO - lease for 24 months, 500 hours annually, sale price of \$99,000.00, monthly payments at \$1,530.00. Heritage Tractor – lease 24 months, 500 hours annually, sale price \$88,294.66, monthly payments \$1,477.47, and purchase price at the end of the lease being \$63,196.13. The intent would be to use the budgeted \$10,500 for rental equipment to make the payments this year and to surplus the grader.

A motion was made by Dan Milligan to approve the purchase of the New Holland E57C mini excavator through CNH Capital: GAHR Truck and Equipment for the lease price of \$73,964.50 for 60 months with \$25,000.00 down, to include the extended warranty for \$3,780.00 and a monthly payment of \$979.83. Anthony Campbell seconded the motion. Anthony Campbell, Dan Milligan, Jim McGlothen, Leonna Coffman

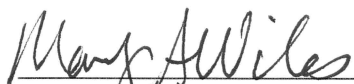

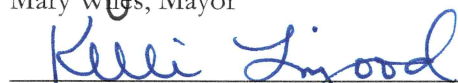
