Planning with ODOT

This is a Big Deal!

Oregon is investing in Walking, Biking, and Transit and Bandon is partnering with them.

The grant is up to \$174, 700 with Bandon matching \$23,823.

Bandon and the Oregon Dept of Transportation (ODOT) will conduct a study with the objective to better integrate transportation, land use planning and developing new ways to manage growth in order to achieve compact pedestrian, bicycle, and transit-friendly urban development. Dana Nichols of the City's Planning Deptartment is the Project Manager.





And what is the translation?

With these funds, as a community we can better plan for safer streets for all. This is a big win for Bandon.

Improvements in our transportation infrastructure benefits both residents and tourists: Investments in safe and accessible pedestrian walkways and bike lanes are investments in the health, sustainability and economic future of our community.

Bandon can open its streets and sidewalks to more people safely while walking and cycling.



Surface update on Playground in City Park

City Staff and the Park and Rec Commission has been considering a new surface for City Park's playground. The current surface has deteriorated overtime and is considered by some, an obnoxious material. To protect children from serious injury from falls, a new playground surface is needed and the old rubber tire surface removed.





This is a combination of turf and poured in place surface.

LOTS OF OPTIONS FOR SURFACES



Poured in place rubber

Easily accessibile for children and families of all abilities, lots of colors and has a low maintenance cost.



Engineered wood fiber

Economical playground surfacing that is used in many playground spaces. It absorbs impact from falls; slip resistant surface.

Eco-friendly, comes in a variety of colors and prevents serious injuries in case of falls.



Turf


