

update on Playground in City Park

- The City was successful in obtaining a \$30k grant from Oregon State Park and Rec Dept. An additional \$6k from City Funds will be a great boost to new play ground equipment.
- The rubber mulch needs to be removed and plans are underway to do just that.
 Be patient. It is going to happen.
- The next step is to replace the rubber chips with something safe and that allows access for all. A new surface is under consideration that will do just that.




Safe Streets for Walking/Cycling

Walking and cycling are two great recreation opportunities especially with Bandon ocean views. How do we encourage walkers and cyclists to get out on the road and yet feel safe?

Many streets in rural communities lack sidewalks and safe streets. And Bandon is no different. While Beach Loop is a designated Bike Route along with Riverview Dr., these narrow streets with no shoulders can be scary.

In communities where the infrastructure can't support safe travels, they have reduced car speeds.

Slower car speeds make for safer streets.
Separated infrastructure like sidewalks and bike lanes, is one of the biggest changes cities can make to city streets to increase the safety of people traveling outside of cars.








Bandon by the Sea

South Jetty Park is four acres of undeveloped river and ocean front. The Northern border is the Coquille River and the entrance to the sea. Here you will see fishing boats, the Coast Guard, surfers, fishing on the beach, agate seekers and rock hounds.




