HOW THE SUMMARIES BOOKS & INDEXES WORK

There are two Collections of Summaries Books and Indexes. The first is for the *Herald Sun*, and the second for *The Age*, both Melbourne newspapers .

HERALD SUN COLLECTION - OVERVIEW

The *Herald Sun* collection consists of three series: the Black Saturday Series, the Supplementary Black Saturday Series, and the National Bushfire Series. Judgments had to be made on what should be included. Items were accepted if they related to Black Saturday, though not everyone would agree on what a related item is.

Each series has its own Summaries Book, accompanied by two indexes, a Subject Index and a People Index, both of which are in the one book and based on the Summaries Book.

Black Saturday Bushfire Series

The Black Saturday Bushfire Series is the first and most comprehensive of the series. The collection consists of about 3000 items from the *Herald Sun* newspaper, from the day after Black Saturday in February 2009 to March 2011. The items have been placed in folders with plastic leaves, with each folder being numbered 1, 2 and so on. There are 17 folders in all. A reference number was given to each item in the following format: the first number is the folder number – the second number is the page number in the folder – the third is the item number on the page. Each number is separated by a dot, and the reference number itself is enclosed in square brackets. For example [1.20.14], represents Folder 1, page 20 of the folder, and item 14 on that page. For the purposes of this project the *Herald Sun* is taken to include the *Sunday Herald Sun*, and any magazine or inserts included in the newspaper.

Black Saturday Bushfire Series Summaries

Every item in each of the 17 folders has been summarised in chronological order, given an index number and recorded in an extensive 350-page Summaries Book, which is set out as follows –

People Index

The People Index of the Black Saturday Bushfire Series is the most comprehensive of any of the People indexes in the series. It aims to include all those named in the coverage, especially those involved and survivors. It does not include journalists, unless they are referred to in the newspaper itself. However, it does include guest writers, for example, Ashraf Doos, a Black Saturday survivor from Marysville. The index is set out as follows –

Supplementary Black Saturday Bushfire Series

The Supplementary Black Saturday Bushfire Series is the second in the *Herald Sun* Collection and is a continuation of the first series. It consists of about 1250 items from the *Herald Sun* newspaper, from April 2011 to November 2019. The items have been placed in folders with plastic leaves, with each folder being numbered S1, S2 and so on. There are 12 folders in all. A reference number was given to each item in the following format: the first number is the folder number – the second number is the page number in the folder – the third is the item number on the page. Each number is separated by a dot, and the reference number itself is enclosed in square brackets. For example [S1.14.1], represents Folder S1, page 14 of the folder, and item 1 on that page. For the purposes of this project the *Herald Sun* is taken to include the *Sunday Herald Sun*, and any magazine or inserts included in the newspaper.

Supplementary Black Saturday Bushfire Summaries

Every item in each of the 12 folders has been summarised in chronological order, given an index number and recorded in an extensive 140-page Summaries Book, which is set out as follows –

National Bushfire Series

The National Bushfire Series collection consists of about 1,500 items from the *Herald Sun* newspaper, from November 2019 to January 2022. This series starts with the Black Summer, 2019/2020. As this collection is ongoing, it will be updated from time to time. The items have been placed in folders with plastic leaves, with each folder being numbered N1, N2 and so on. There are at this point 6 folders in all. A reference number was given to each item in the following format: the first number is the folder number – the second number is the page number in the folder – the third is the item number on the page. Each number is separated by a dot, and the reference number itself is enclosed in square brackets. For example [N2.1.12], represents Folder N2, page 1 of the folder, and item 12 on that page. For the purposes of this project the *Herald Sun* is taken to include the *Sunday Herald Sun*, and any magazine or inserts included in the newspaper.

National Bushfire Series Summaries

Every item in each of the 6 folders has been summarised in chronological order, given an index number and recorded in an extensive 148-page Summaries Book, which is set out as follows –

THE AGE COLLECTION

OVERVIEW

The Age collection consists of two series: The Black Saturday Series and the National Bushfire Series. These series are a limited collection of newspaper cuttings, the first commencing some time after Black Saturday, and the second starting with the Black Summer.

Each series has its own Summaries Book, accompanied by two indexes, a Subject Index and a People Index, both of which are in the one book and based on the Summaries Book.

Black Saturday Bushfire Series

The Black Saturday Bushfire Series consists of a limited collection of about 200 items from the *The Age* newspaper, from August 2010 to June 2019. The items have been placed in folders with plastic leaves, with each folder being numbered A1, A2 and so on. There are three folders in all. A reference number was given to each item in the following format: the first number is the folder number – the second number is the page number in the folder – the third is the item number on the page. Each number is separated by a dot, and the reference number itself is enclosed in square brackets. For example [A3.4.2], represents Folder A3, page 4 of the folder, and item 2 on that page. For the purposes of this project *The Age* is taken to include the *Saturday Age and the Sunday Age*, and any magazine or inserts included in the newspaper.
