Award Ceremony Speech

Presentation Speech by Professor H. Pleijel, Chairman of the Nobel Committee for Physics of the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences, on December 10, 1930

Your Majesty, Your Royal Highnesses, Ladies and Gentlemen.

The Academy of Sciences, has resolved to award the Nobel Prize in Physics for 1930 to Sir Venkata Raman for his work on the scattering of light and for the discovery of the effect named after him.

The diffusion of light is an optical phenomenon, which has been known for a long time. A ray of light is not perceptible unless it strikes the eye directly. If, however, a bundle of rays of light traverses a medium in which extremely fine dust is present, the ray of light will scatter to the sides and the path of the ray through the medium will be discernible from the side. We can represent the course of events in this way, the small particles of dust begin to oscillate owing to electric influence from the ray of light, and they form centres from which light is disseminated in all directions. The wavelength, or the number of oscillations per second, in the light thus diffused is here the same as in the original ray of light. But this effect has different degrees of strength for light with different wavelengths. It is stronger for the short wavelengths than for the long ones, and consequently it is stronger for the blue part of the spectrum than for the red part. Hence if a ray of light containing all the colours of the spectrum passes through a medium, the yellow and the red rays will pass through the medium without appreciable scattering, whereas the blue rays will be scattered to the sides. This effect has received the name of the "Tyndall effect".

Development of MPF System

- As we all know, the MPF System has been set up for 15 years. It is a second pillar system of the World Bank approach to Old Age Protection, i.e. a mandatory, privately managed, and fully funded system. The key purpose of the MPF System is to assist employees in accumulating savings for their retirement.

- Overseas experience shows that it normally takes about 40 years for a retirement protection system to mature. The MPF System, by international standard, is still a relatively young system.

- In measuring the progress of the MPF System, the statistics speak for themselves. Before the MPF System was implemented, it is estimated that only about a third of Hong Kong workers were covered by any sort of occupational retirement protection scheme.

- After the launch of the MPF System, as at December 2015, 85% of Hong Kong's workers (about 3.2 million) were covered by the MPF System or

Award Ceremony Speech

Presentation Speech by Anders Österling, Permanent Secretary of the Swedish Academy

John Steinbeck, the author awarded this year's Nobel Prize in Literature, was born in the little town of **Salinas, California**, a few miles from the Pacific coast near the fertile Salinas Valley. This locality forms the background for many of his descriptions of the common man's everyday life. He was raised in moderate circumstances, yet he was on equal terms with the workers' families in this rather diversified area. While studying at Stanford University, he often had to earn his living by working on the ranches. **He left Stanford without graduating and, in 1925, went to New York as a freelance writer.** After bitter years of struggling to exist, he returned to California, where he found a home in a lonely cottage by the sea. There he continued his writing.

Although he had already written several books by 1935, he achieved his first popular success in that year with ***Tortilla Flat***. He offered his readers spicy and comic tales about a gang of *paisanos*, social individuals who, in their wild revels, are almost caricatures of King Arthur's Knights of the Round Table. It has been said that in the United States this book came as a welcome antidote to the gloom of the then prevailing depression. The laugh was now on Steinbeck's side.

But he had no mind to be an unoffending comforter and entertainer. The topics he chose were serious and denunciatory, as for example the **bitter strikes on California's fruit and cotton plantations which he depicted in his novel *In Dubious Battle* (1936)**. The power of his literary style increased steadily during these years. The little masterpiece ***Of Mice and Men* (1937)**, which is the story of Lennie, the imbecile giant who, out of tenderness, alone squeezes the life out of every living creature that comes into his hands, was followed by those incomparable short stories which he collected in the
