Burn Awareness Week - February 4th - 10th

Pink Shirt Anti-Bullying Day - Kindergarten to Grade Six

The annual pink shirt anti-bullying day is scheduled this year on Wednesday, February 28th. Thousands of people in seven continents in over 75 countries have participated in *Anti-Bullying Awareness Day* by wearing pink to school or work. To show our support, students and staff at Diamond School are encouraged to wear pink on this day in place of their usual dress code. Blue Shirt Day

The Grade Seven class is organizing a schoolwide campaign to raise money to help alleviate a water crisis in Cape Town, South Africa. Currently experiencing a severe drought, Cape Town has imposed extreme water restrictions on its 3.7 million residents as the city's water supply is running dangerously low. Even with these restrictions, as of April 12th this year, all taps will be shut off, and access to water for drinking, showering, animal care and other needs will no longer be available. To help with this situation, students are collecting money in water bottles; funds will then be sent to the Red Cross who will arrange to purchase 5 litre water jugs for people in need of water. Students in all grades from Kindergarten to Grade 12 are welcome to bring in money to help fill their class water bottle. The class that raises the most money for this worthy cause will earn a *no dress code* day.

We have designated Friday, March 2nd as *Blue Shirt Day* to mark the culmination of the students' fundraising efforts. On this day, students may choose to wear blue shirts instead of regular dress code.

School Safety
