OCTOBER FIELD TRIPS & SPECIAL EVENTS:

Hazelmere Pumpkin Patch & Corn Maze Field Trip – Grades Four & Five

Some Reminders about Attendance...

Parking Area Traffic

We are asking for everyone's assistance in adhering to the following safety rules:

*** PULL FORWARD COMPLETELY INTO THE DROP OFF ZONE! ONE CAR BLOCKING THE TRAFFIC FLOW CAN CAUSE A SIGNIFICANT BACKLOG OF TRAFFIC ON HIGHWAY #10.**

*** When there is heavy traffic in the parking lot, please do not stop in the drop off lane. PULL INTO AN EMPTY PARKING SPACE INSTEAD!**

*** Do not park in the drive through areas of the parking lot.**

*** Do not turn left onto Highway #10 when leaving the parking lot, as this is illegal.**

*** Turning left into the school's parking lot from Highway #10 is also illegal and a hazard for other vehicles. Take the time to circle the block and enter by turning right off Highway #10.**
