Ice Skating

Cold Weather Reminder

With the weather being colder, it is important for students to come to school with a warm jacket, as well as a school sweater to wear inside the classroom. Gloves or mittens are advisable to have, along with boots and a change of footwear for the indoors, as they have the opportunity to go outside at recess and lunch daily.

Important Clothing Reminders

Footwear:

- Acceptable school footwear includes dress shoes, runners, or sandals (with back straps) in plain, neutral colours (black, brown, grey, tan, white or navy.) Shoes must be appropriate for school and in good condition. Boots are not acceptable indoor footwear; hence, if students come to school in boots they should have a change of footwear for inside the classroom.
- Please note that bright coloured laces, stripes or soles are not appropriate for school footwear.

Pants:

Dress pants <u>must be a plain, solid black colour</u>. It is not acceptable to wear jogging, jeans, or spandex/velour materials, nor should the pants have alternate colour stitching.
 Faded, torn, defaced clothing <u>is not</u> acceptable. i.e. Black pants that have faded to grey or have outlived their time should be retired!

Feel free to check with the school before you purchase, wear, or otherwise make a commitment to a particular clothing item.

Please ensure that *all school clothing is clearly labeled* with the student's name. Thank you!
