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OVERVIEW

Philip A. Chan, M.D., M.S., is an Associate Professor in the Department of Medicine and School of Public Health at Brown University and infectious diseases physician. Dr. Chan is Chief Medical Officer at Open Door Health, a community-based primary care and sexual health clinic in Providence, Rhode Island. Dr. Chan also serves as a Consultant Medical Director for the Rhode Island Department of Health Division of Emergency Preparedness and Infectious Disease (EPID). He has led parts of the COVID-19 pandemic and other public health responses in the state. He is working both locally and nationally on multiple initiatives related to public health including HIV and other sexually transmitted infections (STI), as well as at Open Door Health to deliver cutting-edge and culturally appropriate healthcare to the community. He is PI of multiple NIH and other programmatic grants, has over 225 peer-reviewed publications, has participated in numerous NIH grant review panels, has presented at hundreds of conferences and media events, trained hundreds of professionals, and received multiple awards for his work. Dr. Chan is committed to improving the health of the community by integrating clinical medicine, public health, research, and training/education.
