OVERALL GARDEN FRIENDS

Marigold: Beneficial insect attractant! Can be used as a cover crop and "plowed" before planting to repel nematodes.
Dill: Attracts pests that love to eat aphids and cabbage moths!
Milkweed: WONDERFUL for Monarchs and their food source.
Nasturtium: Trap crop for aphids and squash bugs!
Ladybugs: LOVES to eat aphids!
Yarrow: Medicinal and has DEEP roots that help soil health!

GREENS, ONION, AND POTATOES!

GREENS-

Cabbage: FRIENDS: cucumbers, potatoes, lettuce and onions.

ENEMIES: Tomatoes, Squash.

ONIONS:

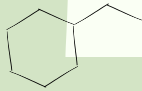
FRIENDS: broccoli, cabbage, cucumber, carrots, peppers, lettuce tomatoes.

ENEMIES: peas and beans

POTATOES-

FRIENDS: beans and peas

ENEMIES: tomatoes

TOMATOES-

FRIENDS: cucumber, onions, peppers

ENEMIES: broccoli, kale, cabbage, corn, potatoes

PEPPERS-

FRIENDS: tomatoes, eggplant, onions

BEANS, PEAS



BEANS-

FRIENDS: radish, eggplant, potatoes, cucumber

ENEMIES: peppers, garlic, onions

PEAS-

FRIENDS: cucumber, carrots, radish, turnip

CUCUMBER AND SQUASH

CUCUMBER-

FRIENDS: cabbage, beans, tomato, peas, radish

ENEMIES: some herbs, but play nice with most.

SQUASH-

FRIENDS: lettuces

ENEMIES: kale and broccoli
