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Thank you for your inquiry regarding affiliate chapters. I am the business agent for the organization. I author the programs and policies for Bikers Against Heroin U.S.A. and I author the same for the affiliate chapters.

We have a comprehensive management system that enables just about anyone to manage a chapter proficiently and within the legitimate legal parameters of a charitable organization. Generally speaking, this is what we do:

- () A corporation is created, domiciled in your state.
- () The corporation signs an affiliation agreement with Bikers Against Heroin U.S.A. (BAUSA)
- () BAUSA provides the affiliate chapter with an accounting system.
- () BAUSA provides the affiliate chapter with a shared data folder structure.
- () BAUSA provides the affiliate chapter with policies, programs and forms.
- () BAUSA provides the affiliate chapter with promotional templates.
- () BAUSA provides affiliate chapter with products to sell.
- () BAUSA provides affiliate chapter with support to raise funds.

You would take administrative control over the Facebook and Twitter accounts that BAHUSA sets up for you. You would manage your own bank account. You would recruit and manage your own board of directors and volunteer group. The organization would reimburse you for expenses you may incur.

As a charitable organization the affiliate chapter contribute it's surplus revenue to the cause, that is the functional purpose of a chapter. The 'cause' is specifically defined. Our national programs meets with the definition. Per agreement the local affiliate contributes 50% of its surplus revenue to the National Fund and the other 50% can be contributed to any local organization (within the affiliate chapter's jurisdiction).

An affiliate chapter following our guidelines and using our support system should be able to raise about \$20,000.00 surplus revenue per year with an all volunteer staff. That's 12 board meetings, four events and ongoing sponsor solicitations. AND, if motivated to do so, the affiliate can do significantly more. The amount of time one may contribute depends upon how many volunteers are recruited and how well they are organized.

I manage the *National Affiliate Program*. I would be your point of contact to launch the new chapter. As an Affiliate Chapter you would become a member of a semi-private Facebook group with other chapter officers sharing strategies.
