Dear Parents and Carers

As we rapidly approach the end of another very busy half term, I would like to reflect on a few of the key moments from the last few weeks and set some dates for after the February half term.

Year 11 have been sitting their second set of Pre-Public Examinations in preparation for GCSE finals in the Spring and Summer terms. Most of the pupils are getting down to some serious revision as colleges and workplaces are starting to ask for predictions of final grades. With a few more weeks of extra revision, all pupils can make a significant difference to their final awards. Additional Enhancement Sessions are being planned for after the half term break based on the performances in the current PPEs.

Year 11: Exam Results Day – GCSE 20 August 2026

Every Year 11 pupil in England will be able to see their GCSE exam results on a new app from summer 2026. Year 11 pupils across England will be able to view their GCSE results on their phones for the first time from this summer, speeding up the process of enrolling into college, freeing up teachers and college staff from unnecessary paperwork, and bringing record-keeping into the 21st century.

Pupils will still go into school on results day to meet face-to-face with their teachers and receive their results. Their results will later become available on the app.

Berlin 2026 – The History department organised for 50 pupils to visit key historical sites in and around Berlin. The trip was a unique opportunity to learn about what happened in Germany during the 1930s and 1940s and, while the country has come to terms with its past and is a central partner in modern Europe, the physical landmarks and memorials are key markers for pupils to learn from. Pupils and staff braved temperatures of minus 5 degrees during the visit and returned with some great memories.

Thanks must go to Mr Webb and his team on the ground in Berlin for their care and consideration for the pupils' wellbeing and safeguarding when plans had to be changed due to unforeseen circumstances. The poor weather conditions had meant the visit to Sachsenhausen was cancelled by the museum management – this gave more time for the visit to the Olympic stadium, and the chance for Mr Webb to exercise his great knowledge of Berlin by visiting alternative attractions. You can see from both the Instagram and X social media sites that the visits to the Olympic Stadium and the East Side Gallery provided excellent opportunities to take some amazing pictures.

Year 9 are also busy thinking about their futures as they begin to commence their options journey with subject Parents' Evening and Options Evening in the next few weeks.

Finally, National Apprenticeship Week runs from Monday 9 - Sunday 15 February. Apprenticeships provide a very popular pathway for many of our pupils when they leave Year 11. The Government has provided some engaging resources which we will be sharing with pupils and yourselves in the next few weeks. 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Year 8: Trip to Portsmouth University – a small group of pupils are busy planning for the future by picking the brains of local University students about Higher Education. 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
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House challenges: This half term has seen the regular House challenges in the form of Taskmaster – from Mr Grant, and Numeracy Challenges from Mr Castle.
