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# Provider Access Policy March 2025 to March 2026

#### Introduction

This policy statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to pupils at the school for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997, (the Baker Clause) and the DfE (2022) Careers guidance and access for education and training providers -Statutory guidance for schools and guidance for further education colleges and sixth form colleges.

### **Pupil entitlement**

All pupils in Years 8-11 are entitled:

- to meaningful encounters with two different providers in Years 8-9, 10-11
- to find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point;
- to hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events;
- to understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses

### **Refusing requests for access**

Decisions to grant or refuse access are taken based on such aspects as timing, relevance to key decision-making points and whether information has already been given by another provider. Decisions to remove pupils from timetabled lessons, particularly at KS4, will not be taken lightly.

#### **Premises and facilities**

The school will make the main hall, classrooms or private meeting rooms available for discussions between the provider and students, as appropriate to the activity. The school will also make available AV and other specialist equipment to support provider presentations. This will all be discussed and agreed in advance of the visit with the Careers Leader or a member of their team. Providers are welcome to leave a copy of their prospectus or other relevant course literature at the Main Reception. The information will then be disseminated out via tutor times with copies being held in the Learning Resource Centre which is available to all students at lunch and break times, and links to the providers will be made on the Careers part of the school website.
