Dear Parents and Carers

End of Half Term/COVID-19/ Start of next Half Term

Thank you for your sustained support during a really busy and successful first half term of the academic year. Highlights include: Over 450 visitors to the school via personalised tours for potential new students in September 2022, Knife Crime Education workshops led by Hampshire Constabulary, Drop Everything and Read sessions focused on famous artists, over 350 COVID-19 vaccinations, the launch of a new Behaviour Policy, successful Year 11 Geography Field Trips, the annual Fishing Trip to Meon Springs, the opening of two new Science labs (with two more under construction!) and many great sporting successes – all detailed on our school Twitter pages - @PCSInformation and @PortchesterPE



This half term ends on Friday 22 October from 3.10 pm. There is a dedicated group of students who will be in school during half term rehearsing for the Christmas Cabaret – tickets will be available soon.

Also, during half term, we are having banks of solar panels installed on the roofs of the Main Hall and Gym. Contractors will be giving a presentation to students about the purpose and potential impact of the panels early next half term.





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Term starts again on Monday 1 November 2021

To ensure a safe return to school, we will be completing Lateral Flow Tests with each Year group within a given time period on Monday 1 November 2021. Therefore, there will be a staggered start to the day.

If a positive Lateral Flow Test result is registered, the student will be directed to take a PCR Test to confirm if they have COVID-19.

Students will receive a single test unit for use in the Sports Hall upon their return to school. Should they require additional test kits, these can be collected from Student Reception, as usual.

Students on transport will come into school at their usual time, but will be required to wear a mask, where appropriate, until testing is complete. They will work with members of the Learning Support team until lesson and testing starts.

COVID-19

We, here at the school and at Hampshire County Council, are aware of significant numbers of positive cases in school aged children across Hampshire. Many schools have reached a threshold in the Contingency Framework to seek additional support and guidance from the Department for Education.

The thresholds are five children, pupils, students or staff, who are likely to have mixed closely, test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period and/or 10% of children, pupils, students or staff who are likely to have mixed closely, test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period.

There are baseline infection prevention and control measures that we have in place already as standard, while infection rates in the community remain high:

- Encourage at least twice weekly Lateral Flow Device (LFD) home testing for all staff and pupils.
- Self-isolation for anyone who tests positive.
- Promote the uptake of the 12-15 year-old COVID-19 vaccinations.
- Promote the uptake of the COVID-19 booster vaccinations for all eligible groups.
- Ensure good ventilation.
- Promote good hand hygiene.
- Reinforce messages on symptoms and self-isolation.



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On advice from the UK Health Security Agency and the Department for Education, I am writing to make clear the additional measures we might need to put into place should we reach this key threshold. These could include:

- Bringing back wearing of face coverings in indoor or communal spaces for students and staff.
- Daily LFD testing for siblings and household contacts of positive cases while waiting for result of PCR test as long as they remain asymptomatic
- Increased daily testing for specific secondary age groups with high numbers of positive cases for a defined period, minimum five days, with the last day being a school day.
- One off round of LFD testing for a wider cohort in a secondary school.
- Staggered start/end arrangements.
- Limit residential visits, parents' evenings, open days, face-to-face meetings, transition events and productions.

We support the Contingency Framework which is clear that face-to-face education remains the overarching objective of guidance and policy.

We anticipate that these measures will have an impact on reducing the transmission of COVID-19 and protect education for all students.
