Summer School



Overview / Information.

- Session times are: Morning: 10:00-12:30. Afternoon sessions: 1:00-2:30 pm.
- Each day will start with a formal **registration** of attendance and checking in with each student in the Main Hall.
- Groups will leave from there to their designated activities with key staff.
- Snacks will be provided at break time, and a lunch will be provided.
- (Students can also bring their own refreshments)
- Students should wear clothes appropriate to the activities for the day. Appearance should be **casual but respectable.**
- We will dismiss from the main hall at the end of the afternoon session students with permission from parent will make their own way home or wait to be collected



Current guidance- Testing in September



- All secondary school and college students should be offered 2 onsite LFD tests at an ATS, 3 to 5 days apart, on their return in the autumn term.
- Following the 2 on-site LFD tests on return in the autumn term, secondary school students should continue to test twice weekly at home until the end of September, when this will be reviewed. Staff should also undertake twice weekly home tests until the end of September, when this will be reviewed.
- Consent forms have been emailed home please respond by the start of term.








