Information about the virus


COVID-19 is a new type of coronavirus that causes illness in people by affecting their lungs and therefore their breathing.

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are a new, continuous cough, a high temperature (over 37.8 degrees) or loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).

For most people, coronavirus (COVID-19) will be a mild infection.

Children are likely to become infected with coronavirus (COVID-19) at roughly the same rate as adults, but the infection is usually mild.

It can be spread from person to person by coughing or touching surfaces or areas of skin that have been contaminated by the virus.



How to avoid catching or spreading microbes

There are things you can do to help stop viruses like coronavirus spreading.


Do:

- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately
- ✓ wash your hands with soap and water often use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are
 not available
- try to avoid close contact with people who are unwell

Don't:

X do not touch your eyes, nose or mouth if your hands are not clean







How can you stop coronaviruses spreading?

If you need to cough or sneeze



Catch it with a tissue



Bin it



Kill it by washing your hands with soap & water or hand sanitiser

You should wash hands with soap & water or hand sanitiser



After breaks & sport activities



Before cooking & eating



On arrival at any childcare or educational setting



After using the toilet



Before leaving home



Try not to touch your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands



Do not share items that come into contact with your mouth such as cups & bottles



If unwell do not share items such as bedding, dishes, pencils & towels

Masks

- Carry one at all times
- Keep it in a bag to protect it
- Make sure your hands are clean before you put it on and take it off
- If you use a reusable mask and it is damp, you must put it in a bag and clean it before wearing it again
- If you use a disposable one, you must put it in the non-recyclable bin once you have finished using it
- Think about how you travel to school- if you travel on a bus you must wear one
- When to/ not wear one around school communal areas start school/breaks


5 Days of the School Week

5 Year Group Learning Bubbles. Years 7-11

5 Learning Areas with separate School Entrances and Break / Lunch spaces

Each Year Group Learning Bubble will be allocated a different Learning Area for each day of the week

Lessons within the Learning Area will rotate during the day



- The school day- including breakfast and homework club breakfast club will not start for the next two weeks at least; this will then be reviewed and if and when it is deemed safe to start, it will only be on your assembly day – Wednesday
- Homework Club and the LRC will only be accessible if you are in the bubble that is in that area – Technology/PE

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Arrival and departure from school- including what to do if late

You must know what bubble you are in at the start of the day and arrive and leave at the entrance designated

If you are late, you must go to Student Reception to sign in and then someone will take you to your learning area

What to bring/ not bring to school

Bring only what you will need for that day; if you have PE then come into school wearing your PE kit.

If you are cold you are allowed your blazer or school coat, no hoodie!

Black or navy tracksuit bottoms will be allowed over your shorts/PE leggings, if it is cold

There are no catering facilities so you should bring a packed lunch in your bag
