If Turkeys Can't Fly, Can Colonel's Announce.???

Do you remember the 1978 monster TV hit series "WKRP in Cincinnatti "? It told the hilarious misadventures of a struggling radio station. One memorable misadventure was the flying turkey's episode. As a station promotion they threw turkeys out of an helicopter only to discover, to their dismay, that turkeys cannot fly. Even today people still recall and laugh about that episode. As I watched each episode back then I could not help but think back to some of my own memorable misadventures at my first radio station in 1958, the English language, privately owned 250 watt radio station CJQC in Quebec City.

WKRP had attractive downtown studios and gorgeous receptionist, Lonnie Anderson. We had no comparison. Enough said.

CJQC was located in a very old farmhouse miles out of town. Indoor water and plumbing had recently been added. Other than that, it was just as it had been when the Clampets likely lived there. But it was a place to start a new career, make mistakes, dream of bigger and better things. Aline and I loved Quebec City, we made friendships there that we still cherish today.

Let me share with you one memorable true incident that equals the flying turkey's story. One day CJQC Manager Harold Burnside told me there was an army Colonel at the army base Camp Val Cartier, just up the road from us, coming in to audition for a job. The Colonel was retiring soon and wanted to remain in Quebec City. He felt he had a good radio voice. CJQC was to be his launching pad. I was ordered to prepare a stand up microphone, cue up theme music for our program "Music For my Lady" and write a five second personal intro for him as he was going to do his audition LIVE to air. Yes I said "Live to air" unheard of but remember this was 1958, a 250 watt English language radio station in 99.9 % French speaking Quebec City.

Colonel Jim Jones arrived, [alias given to protect the innocent]. His eyes widened when told he would host the program "Music for My Lady" live. He was given his program introduction, given earphones, and told to stand by the mic and watch my hand for his cue.

The hand on the studio clock finally hit the hour, theme music started then faded down, I gave the Colonel his cue.

He began "Good morning ladies, this is Jim Jones speaking, welcome to Music for my Lady..." he then stiffened straight up erect in his best army Colonel position, and feinted, falling backwards straight as a board, striking his head on the floor, out like a light. When he came to, he stood up, never said a word, brushed himself off, marched out of the studio, down the hall, out the front door, never to be seen or heard on CJQC again.

Aline and I soon left Quebec City for beautiful BC. CJQC closed soon after thus ending the possible radio career of army Colonel Jim Jones.
